Re: Potash Lease Application

Dear Ms. Keller:

The New Mexico State Land Office has been informed that Intrepid Potash intends to reopen its underground North Mine in southeastern New Mexico. This is a very significant event for the potash industry and southeastern New Mexico's economic outlook. As part of its North Mine mining operation Intrepid has applied for a 640 acre tract of state trust land located in Sec. 16, T-21-S, R-31-E in Eddy County. The acreage is within the area covered by the Oil Commission's Rule R-111-P. All required submittals for processing this lease application have been submitted to the Land Office and the lease is pending approval at the Land Office

The eastern half of the section that Intrepid seeks is also under an oil and gas lease issued to Fasken Oil and Gas Company which is held by production from the Laguna # 1 well. The western half of the section that Intrepid seeks is under another Fasken lease, which would have expired except that the Land Office extended the lease for five years to provide time to resolve Fasken's application to drill the Fasken Laguna # 2 in the western half of the section. That application is pending before the Division examiner where both Fasken and Intrepid have submitted evidence for the Division's consideration. Intrepid has a very substantial interest in the APD proceedings for the Laguna # 2 because that well would directly impact Intrepid's ability to mine its adjacent federal potash leases as well as to mine Section 16 itself.

The State Land Office intends to hold the Intrepid lease application pending final resolution and appeals of the Division's hearing process. The Land Office will issue the appropriate lease once the issues under R-111-P have been finally decided.
