STATEMENT OF THE CASE

APPLICANT:

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(1) Chesapeake is an operator in the Pool.

(2) The Southwest Willow Lake Delaware Pool was created by Division Order R-11120, dated February 1, 1999. The horizontal limits of the pool, as amended, are described as follows:

Township 25 South. Range 28 East

Section 3:AllSection 4:E/2Section 9:NE/4 Section 10: All Section 15: NE14

(3) The Southwest Willow Lake Delaware Pool is governed by the Division's statewide spacing and setback rules which provide for oil wells to be dedicated to 40- acre spacing units and to be located no closer than 330 feet to a quarter-quarter section line. NMAC 19.15.15.9.

(4) Pursuant to Division Rule 19.15.20.12 NMAC, the Pool has a depth bracket allowable of 80 barrels of oil per day.

(5)Chesapeake requests that the Division promulgate special rules and regulations for the Southwest Willow Lake Delaware Pool, providing for a depth bracket allowable of 800 barrels of oil per day, with a limiting gas-oil ratio of 2000 cubic feet of gas for each barrel of oil produced.

(6) Chesapeake requests that the special rules and regulations be made effective January 1, 2009.

(7) The assignment of a greater than regular depth bracket allowable will not cause damage to the reservoir or cause surface or underground waste.

(8) Approval of this application will be in the best interest of conservation and the protection of correlative rights.
