Dear Mr. Fesmire:

Order No. R-13128 granted the applications of Enervest Operating LLC to amend the unit agreement and unit operating agreement for the West Loco Hills Grayburg No. 4 Sand Unit, and to expand the waterflood project for the unit. Portions of the order, attached as Exhibit A, contain a property description error: Pages 3 and 9 describe the unit area, but certain lands in §18-18S-30E, noted on Exhibit A, are incorrect. The "<u>W</u>/2NW/4" should be the "<u>E</u>/2NW/4," and the "<u>E</u>/2NE/4" should be the "<u>W</u>/2NE/4." Attached as Exhibit B is a portion of a draft order I submitted, which reflects the correct descriptions; and attached as Exhibit C is the original unitization order.

These errors were pointed out by the State Land Office, which requires a correct description in order to grant its final approval. Enervest is trying to finalize statutory unitization this week, so a *Nunc Pro Tunc* order within the next day or so would be greatly appreciated.
