STATEMENT OF CASE

APPLICANT

Cimarex Energy Co. seeks an order approving a non-standard spacing and proration unit (project area) in the Bone Spring formation comprised of the N/2 N/2 of Section 34, Township 19 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, to form a non-standard 160-acre spacing and proration unit (project area), and pooling all mineral interests in the Bone Spring formation underlying the non-standard unit. The unit is to be dedicated to the Mallon 34 Fed. Well No. 20, a horizontal well to be drilled with a surface location at an orthodox location in the NE/4 NE/4, and a terminus at an orthodox location on the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 34. Also to be considered will be the costs of drilling and completion the well and the allocation of the costs thereof, as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of Cimarex Energy Co. of Colorado as operator of the well, and a 200% charge for risk involved in drilling and completing the well.

OPPOSITION OF OTHER PARTY

Pear Resources will appear and present testimony in opposition to the application of Cimarex Energy Co. Pear Resources is the owner of working interest that is subject to this application. Pear Resources will show that Cimarex failed to engage in good faith negotiations for the voluntary commitment of the Pear Resources interests to the proposed well and therefore is not entitled to a pooling order under the Oil and Gas Act. Pear Resources will request that, if the lands are pooled, that (i) only the Bone Spring formation be pooled, (ii) a risk penalty of no more than 100% be imposed on the pooled interests, (iii) the pooling order expire at the end of 90 days unless Cimarex has commenced the proposed well thereby preventing the use of the Division's rules to tie up the acreage of other owners where there is no immediate plan to drill, and (iv) reducing the AFE charges to a reasonable amount thereby assuring that the amount that owners subject to pooling must pay to avoid the risk penalty set by the order is not inflated.



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
