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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:10 a.m.: Okay, I believe today we CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: 3 have a fairly short agenda, so we can go ahead and get 4 This is January 15th, 2004, the first meeting of 5 started. the Oil Conservation Commission for this year. I note once 6 7 again we have snow on the day of the Commission meeting. 8 I'm thinking maybe we should schedule more frequent meetings, with the drought, I don't know. 9 (Off the record) 10 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: I'll just note that all 11 three Commissioners are present this morning. We have, I 12 believe, three action items on the agenda and one we may 13 14 need to talk about the status of, I'm not sure. 15 MR. BROOKS: I don't know anything about that. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay. Well, the 16 17 conversation will be short. The first item is the minutes of the hearing of 18 the Oil Conservation Commission held on December 11th, 19 20 2003. Commissioners, have you had a chance to review those minutes? 21 22 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move 23 that we adopt them. 24 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Do I hear a second? 25 COMMISSIONER LEE: Second.

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1	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye.
2	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
3	COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye.
4	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. And I'll sign those
5	minutes on behalf of the Commission.

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8	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, and the second item
9	is the annual resolution required by the Open Meetings Act.
10	And David, do you want to just introduce this item for us?
11	MR. BROOKS: Do you have the You have it
12	printed it out, okay.
13	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Yes.
14	MR. BROOKS: Yes, the Open Meetings Act, New
15	Mexico Statutes Annotated Sections 10-15-1 and following,
16	provide that a public body shall not less than annually
17	adopt a resolution prescribing a means by which it will
18	comply with the provisions of that act with regard to the
19	conduct of its proceedings and manner of giving notice of
20	its proceedings.
21	The resolution that is proposed for this year is
22	very similar to the one that the Commission adopted in
23	2003, but it has a couple of changes to comply with our
24	or to conform to the statutory enactment of the 2003
25	Legislature and also to changes in notice rules that are

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1 proposed for adoption today.

2	And there is one other change that The
3	previous resolution stated that a member of the Commission
4	may participate in meetings by conference telephone or
5	similar equipment when it's difficult or impossible for the
6	member to be present, and we deleted the Commission and
7	simply said a member of the Commission may participate in
8	meetings by conference telephone or other similar
9	communication equipment.
10	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Any questions,
11	Commissioners?
12	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: No.
13	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, I don't hear any
14	questions. Then I'll entertain a motion that we approve
15	the open meetings resolution for 2004.
16	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move that we approve the
17	resolution.
18	COMMISSIONER LEE: Second.
19	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye.
20	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
21	COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye.
22	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And this one we all three
23	sign.
24	Okay, thank you, David.

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And we still have Case 1 13,100 on the docket. We're carrying it from month to 2 This is the Application of the Fruitland Coalbed month. 3 Methane Study Committee to amend Rules 4 and 7 of Special 4 Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas 5 Pool, and this was the part of the case that was bifurcated 6 7 from Case 12,888. MR. BROOKS: Correct. 8 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Have we heard anything from 9 the parties in this matter? 10 MR. BROOKS: Not since the last Commission 11 I conferred with counsel before the last meeting. 12 13 Commission meeting and was informed that they wanted it to be carried because they were still attempting to finalize a 14 settlement. 15 Like I say, I haven't heard from them since that 16 meeting. 17 18 Since there's no one here requesting that it be 19 heard, I would guess my recommendation would be that we 20 carry it another month, and I will endeavor to find out the 21 status of negotiations prior to the February 12th Commission Hearing. 22 23 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: That will be helpful. 24 Thank you. 25 * * *

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CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And then that takes us to 1 Case 13,187, the Application of the New Mexico Oil 2 Conservation Division to amend various procedural rules. 3 We heard testimony on this case at the last 4 Commission meeting, and David has prepared for us a draft 5 order with an attached Rule. 6 He also did a little investigation on the 7 question that Mr. Bemis raised --8 MR. BROOKS: Correct. 9 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- at the hearing in --10 MR. BROOKS: Yes, Florene Davidson contacted the 11 Albuquerque Journal. Mr. Bemis had raised the question 12 whether there was such a thing as a newspaper of general 13 circulation in the State, and we had suggested that we 14 believe the Albuquerque Journal to be that. 15 Ms. Davidson has contacted the Journal, and they 16 have told us that they believe themselves to be such and 17 that they routinely make affidavits to that effect in 18 19 connection with applications. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you. 20 So if Commissioner Bailey will --21 22 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I'll --CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- relay that 23 information --24 25 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Thank you.

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CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- to Mr. Bemis, we'd 1 appreciate it. 2 3 And Mr. Brooks has prepared a draft order for our consideration. 4 Commissioners, have you had a chance to review 5 the order? 6 7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move we 8 adopt it. COMMISSIONER LEE: Second. 9 10 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye. 11 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 12 COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye. 13 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. Trying to find the 14 signature page. There we go. 15 * * * 16 17 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, I think we've covered 18 the Commission's agenda in very short order here. Is there 19 anything else we need to address today, Mr. Brooks? 20 MR. BROOKS: Not that I'm aware of. 21 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Ms. Davidson? 22 MS.
