## **APPLICATION**

Mewbourne Oil Company applies for an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Yeso formation underlying the SE½NW½ of Section 22, Township 20 South, Range 25 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico, and in support thereof, states:

- 1. Applicant is an interest owner in the SE¼NW¼ of Section 14, and has the right to drill a well thereon.
- 2. Applicant proposes to drill its Quick Draw "22" F Well No. 1, at an orthodox location in the SE¼NW¼ of Section 22, to a depth sufficient to test the Yeso formation, and seeks to dedicate the SE¼NW¼ of Section 22 to the well to form a standard 40 acre oil spacing and proration unit for all pools or formations developed on 40-acre spacing within that vertical extent, including the North Seven Rivers Glorieta-Yeso Pool.
- 3. Applicant has in good faith sought to obtain the voluntary joinder of all other mineral interest owners in the SE½NW¼ of Section 22 for the purposes set forth herein.
- 4. Although applicant attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral interest owners to participate in the drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interests to the well, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests. Therefore, applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interest owners in the SE¼NW¼ of Section 22, pursuant to NMSA 1978 §70-2-17.

5. The pooling of all mineral interests underlying the SE¼NW¼ of Section 22 will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste, and protect correlative rights.

**WHEREFORE**, applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its order:

- A. Pooling all mineral interests in the SE¼NW¼ of Section 22, from the surface to the base of the Yeso formation;
- B. Designating applicant as operator of the well;
- C. Considering the cost of drilling and completing the well, and allocating the cost among the well's working interest owners;
- D. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and
- E. Setting a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well in the event a working interest owner elects not to participate in the well.
