873 ("Apache"), through its undersigned attorneys, hereby APACHE CORPORATION makes application for an order approving its Equis State Exploratory Unit and in support of this application states:

1. The proposed Unit Area for the Equis State Exploratory Unit consists of 2,480.00 acres, more or less, of State of New Mexico lands, situated in Lea County, New Mexico. The horizontal limits of said unit are described as follows:

Township 14 South, Range 35 East, N.M.P.M.

Section 8: N/2, E/2SW/4, SE/4 Section 9: All

Section 16: All Section 17: All

- The Unit Agreement has been approved by a sufficient percentage of the interest owners within the proposed Unit Area to provide effective control of unit operations.
- 3 The Applicant, Apache Corporation, is designated as Unit Operator in said Unit Agreement and all oil and gas in the all formations are unitized.
- 4. The unitized interval includes all formations from the surface to the base of the Precambrian formation.
- 5. Said Unit Agreement and the unitized operation and management of the Unit Area will be in the interest of conservation and the prevention of waste, and will protect the correlative rights of all parties concerned.

WHEREFORE, Apache Corporation requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on September 2, 2010, that notice be given as required by law and the rules of the Division, and that the Equis State Exploratory Unit be approved.
