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1	WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at
2	9:12 a.m.:
3	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And that brings us to Case
4	13,215, this is the Application of the Valles Caldera Trust
5	to deny applications of GeoProducts of New Mexico, Inc.,
6	for permits to re-enter abandoned geothermal wells in
7	Sandoval County, New Mexico. Geoproducts of New Mexico,
8	Inc., has filed two Applications for permits to re-enter
9	geothermal wells located on the Baca Grant Number 1 in
10	Sandoval County, New Mexico. I believe it's Number 1
11	rather than Number 4, isn't it, Mr. Brooks?
12	MR. BROOKS: I believe that is correct.
13	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: And the Applicant in this
14	case, Valles Caldera Trust, seeks an order of the
15	Commission denying the Applications.
16	We have set this matter for hearing on some
17	preliminary legal issues only for today. We did ask the
18	parties to file briefs on those preliminary legal issues,
19	and the parties have filed those briefs.
20	Neither of the parties asked for oral argument on
21	these issues. But we do, before we to start our
22	deliberations, want to ask the Commissioners if they have
23	any questions of the parties.
24	MR. BROOKS: Are you going to call for
25	appearances?
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CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Yes. And then we also want 1 to give anybody that would like to make a comment on these 2 3 issues to come forward and make a short statement, if you 4 wish. So at this point I'll call for appearances in 5 this case. 6 7 MR. GALLEGOS: Appearing on behalf of the Trust, 8 Gene Gallegos, Santa Fe, New Mexico. Along with me is Tom 9 Kellahin, Santa Fe, and Jack McCarthy, Santa Fe. MR. CLOUTIER: Andrew Cloutier and Jim Bruce on 10 behalf of GeoProducts of New Mexico. 11 12 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you. Is there 13 anybody else here today that would like to make a comment or statement on this matter? 14 15 Yes, sir? MR. LARSEN: Yes, Cliff Larsen with the Sierra 16 Club. 17 18 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you. 19 Okay Commissioners, you have had a chance, I 20 believe, to review the briefs that were filed in this 21 Do you have any questions of the parties at this matter. 22 point? 23 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I don't believe so. 24 COMMISSIONER LEE: Neither do I. 25 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Mr. Brooks, how about you?

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1	MR. BROOKS: I don't believe I have at the
2	moment, no.
3	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay. In that case I'll
4	just ask, Mr. Gallegos, Mr. Cloutier, would you like to
5	make a brief statement before the Commission? We don't
6	expect extensive oral argument, but if you would like to
7	make a brief statement we'd entertain that at this point.
8	MR. GALLEGOS: Well, thank you, madame Chair. I
9	think we'll stand on the pleadings that have been filed. I
10	think we've covered the issues sufficiently. Unless
11	there's questions on any of those things, which we'd be
12	happy to answer, I think that will be our position. Thank
13	you.
14	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Gallegos.
15	Mr. Cloutier?
16	MR. CLOUTIER: Madame Chair, thank you. In the
17	absence of questions from the Chair or from the
18	Commissioners and counsel, we'll stand on our brief as
19	well. Thank you.
20	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Cloutier.
21	Mr. Larsen?
22	MR. LARSEN: Yes. This case is being governed in
23	part, or in whole, by the rules that were adopted November
24	15th of 1983 pursuant to the Geothermal Resources Act,
25	1978. These particular rules are clearly more than 20

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years old, and developed at a time -- a considerable 1 difference in the way things were done and how they were 2 3 done. And I want to call your attention to the Act 4 itself, that suggested that rules needed to be developed in 5 a matter to safequard health, life, property and natural 6 7 resources in the public welfare. These rules developed or adopted in 1983, that 8 are not on your website, are done at a time when the goal 9 was to maximize recovery of the resource itself. 10 The rules are virtually silent on other issues that the Act suggested 11 12 that the rules should encompass. I worked on, as you know, the Pit Rule for some 13 while, taking into consideration some of these issues in 14 15 oil and gas drilling that this Act suggests should be taken into consideration in geothermal drilling. 16 17 And I guess what I'm asking at this point is that the Commission panel a working group to overhaul these 18 19 rules that more fulfill the current environment, as well as 20 the conditions of the Act, and that -- moreover, that until 21 these rules are redrawn and adopted, that no action be 22 taken on any applications to drill, simply because the 23 rules as they are are updated and inappropriate currently. 24 Thank you. 25 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Thank you, Mr. Larsen.

Okay, at this point, then, I will entertain a 1 motion that the Commission move into closed executive 2 3 session, during which it will deliberate in this particular 4 matter. COMMISSIONER BAILEY: 5 I so move. COMMISSIONER LEE: Second. 6 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye. 7 8 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 9 COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye. 10 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. Thank you, everyone. 11 (Off the record at 9:19 a.m.) 12 (The following proceedings had at 10:45 a.m.:) 13 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Are we ready to go back on the record? 14 15 At this point I'll entertain a motion that we go 16 back into open meeting. 17 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I so move. COMMISSIONER LEE: Second. 18 19 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye. 20 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 21 COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye. 22 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Aye. And I'll note for the 23 record that the only matter discussed by the Commission while we were in closed executive session was Case 13,215. 24 And Commissioners, I believe you have a copy of a 25

1	proposed order that reflects the discussion we had this
2	morning.
3	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I have, and I move
4	that we all sign it.
5	COMMISSIONER LEE: Second.
6	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say aye.
7	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye.
8	COMMISSIONER LEE: Aye.
