Reference is made to the following:

- (a) your application (administrative application reference No. pTGW10-22834073) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on August 16, 2010, and
 - (b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

Merrion Oil & Gas Corporation [OGRID 14634] (Merrion) has requested to drill the above-referenced well at an unorthodox gas well location described above in the caption of this letter. The W/2 of Section 9 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing unit in the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool (71629). Spacing in this pool is governed by the Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool, as amended by Order No. R-8768-F, effective July 17, 2003, which provide generally for 320-acre units with wells to be located at least 660 feet from any unit boundary. Additionally, the SW/4 of Section 9 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 160-acre gas spacing unit in the West Kuntz-Pictured Cliff's Gas Pool (79680). Spacing in the West Kuntz Pictured Cliff's Pool is governed by Rule 15.10.C, which provides for 160-acre units with wells to be located at least 660 feet from the unit outer boundary.



This location is unorthodox in both pools because it is less than 660 feet from the eastern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 15.13 and 4.12.A(2).

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location in order to conform to applicable City of Farmington siting requirements.

It is also understood that you have given due notice of this application to all operators or owners who are "affected persons," as defined in Rule 4.12.A(2), in all adjoining units towards which the proposed location encroaches.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 15.13.B, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 5.9.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.

- (a) your application (administrative application reference No. pTGW10-22835057) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on August 16, 2010, and
 - (b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

Merrion Oil & Gas Corporation [OGRID 14634] (Merrion) has requested to drill the above-referenced well at an unorthodox well location, as described above in the caption of this letter. The NW/4 of Section 9 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 160-acre gas spacing unit in the West Kutz Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool (79680). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 15.10.B, which provides for 160-acre units, with wells located at least 660 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 660 feet from the southern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 15.13 and 4.12.A(2).



It is our understanding that you are seeking this location in order to comply with City of Farmington surface location requirements and to avoid interference with existing surface uses.

It is also understood that notice of this application to offsetting operators or owners is unnecessary due to common ownership.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 15.13.B, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 5.9.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
