## CASE 14567 (Continued and Re-advertised):

Application of Endurance Resources, LLC for approval of a salt water disposal well, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks approval to utilize its Marshall Well No. 2 (API No. 30-025-08359), located 1980 feet from the South line and 1910 feet from the West line of Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 33 East, NMPM, to inject up to 3000 barrels of water per day, at a maximum pressure of 800 psi, into the Delaware formation, (Ramsey Sand), Cruz-Delaware Pool, at an approximate depth of 5105 feet to 5180 feet. This well is located approximately 25 miles southwest of Eunice, New Mexico.

Application of Endurance Resources, LLC for approval of a salt water disposal well, Lea County, New Mexico.
