Through the additional drilling of wells adjacent to the West Lovington Strawn Unit Area, it has been determined that the Chandler #1 (WLSU #13) and the State "S" #1 (WLSU #12) wells are in communication with the reservoir previously unitized and subject to the West Lovington Unit Area. Therefore, expansion of the existing unit area is advisable because of the more efficient manner of development and operations afforded thereby. Enclosed please find a copy of a letter from the Bureau of Land Management dated November 25, 1996, granting preliminary approval of the expansion as proposed. Also, enclosed you will find a revised copy of Exhibit "C" to the West Lovington Strawn Unit Agreement which incorporates the expanded tracts.

Gillespie-Crow, Inc. has contracted UnitSource Incorporated to assist in the proposed expansion of the existing West Lovington Strawn Unit Area, which is currently a 1,458.95 acre pressure maintenance unit covering the Strawn Formation under the lands shown on the enclosed map of the Unit Area.

We are presently contacting all working and royalty interest owners affected by the expansion and invite them to commit their interest to the Unit Agreement. Therefore, for your consideration and execution we are enclosing the following:

- 1. Copy of the West Lovington Strawn Unit Agreement with Exhibits "A", "B" and "C" thereto, and,
- 2. Six (6) copies of the Ratification and Joinder instrument to the expansion of the West Lovington Strawn Unit Agreement.

We request that you review the Exhibits and advise of any discrepancies regarding your ownership in the oil and gas rights within the unit.

A technical review by the Unit Operator in the West Lovington Strawn Unit was conducted to investigate the affect the Chandler #1 (WLSU #13) and the State "S" #1 (WLSU #12) wells have on the unitized Strawn reservoir under the existing unit area.

The Unit Operator and over 99.7% of the Cost Bearing Working Interest Owners have concluded that the above mentioned wells and lands are benefiting from the on going pressure maintenance operations in the West Lovington Strawn Unit Area, and therefore expansion of the unit area would be economically advantageous, improve the efficiency of the reservoir and recover a substantial amount of oil that would otherwise be unrecoverable under primary operations on a lease basis.

This pressure maintenance/secondary recovery program, involves injecting natural gas into the producing formation through selected well(s) located at the structurally highest point in said reservoir in order to supplement the natural energy of the reservoir and force oil trapped in the rock to the structurally lower producing wells. This process displaces oil across property or lease lines which makes it necessary to unitize <u>all</u> properties affected by the injection in a way that they can be treated and operated as a single property. The working and royalty interest owners then share in the oil produced from the entire unit area based upon their unit participation.

Unit participation is determined by allocating to each property or tract a percentage of the unit's overall production based upon a formula negotiated by the working interest owners within the unit. The formula allows equitable sharing in the increased unit production because it represents the best estimate of the amount of recoverable oil under each tract. The percentage of the unit's overall production which is allocated to the various tracts is shown on Exhibit "C" attached to the unit agreement.

Prior to approving expansion of the West Lovington Strawn Unit Agreement, the Bureau of Land Management will review the geological and engineering data and unit documents to determine whether the participation formula is fair and equitable and protects the rights of all owners within the unit and proposed expansion. Another review of the expansion will occur at a public hearing before the New Mexico Oil and Gas Conservation Division (Division). You will be notified pursuant to state statute when this matter will be presented before the Division

As a royalty interest owner you will benefit from the projected increase in the amount of oil recovered but will not be responsible for any costs associated with the pressure maintenance project.
