APPLICATION

YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION ("Yates"), by its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application to the Oil Conservation Division for an order adopting Special Pool Rules and Regulations for the Salt Lake–Delaware Pool, and in support of its application states:

1. The Salt Lake-Delaware Pool was created by Division Order No. R-9685, dated July 1, 1992, as the result of the discovery of oil in the Yates Petroleum Corporation Belco AIA Federal Well No. 1 located 1980 feet from the South and East lines of Section 14, Township 20 South, Range 32 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. This well produces through perforations from 4928 feet to 4956 feet in the Delaware formation. The NW/4 SE/4 of said Section 14 is dedicated to the well.

2. The pool is comprised of the following acreage:

Township 20 South, Range 32 East, NMPM

Section 14: SE/4

3. The Belco AIA Federal Well No. 1 can produce at rates in excess of the authorized depth bracket allowable for wells completed at a depth less than 5000 feet.

4. Yates seeks the adoption of Special Pool Rules and Regulations which provide for oil spacing units comprised of 80 surface contiguous acres, more of less, comprising any two contiguous quarter sections of a single section being a legal subdivision of the U. S. Public Lands Surveys with wells

located no closer than 330 feet from the outer boundary of the quarter section on which the well is located and no closer than 10 feet to any quarter-quarter section line or inner subdivision inner boundary.

4. Approval of the requested special spacing and well location requirements will result in orderly development of these oil reserves and will result in a development pattern which will effectively and efficiently drain the oil reserves in this pool.

5. Approval of this application will avoid wasteful development practices and will otherwise be in the best interest of conservation, the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Yates Petroleum Corporation requests that this application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on March 13, 2003, that notice be given as required by law and the rules of the Division, and that the application be approved.
