WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 11:42 a.m.: 3 4 5 EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I'll call the 6 7 next case, Number 11,486, which is in the matter of the hearing called by the Oil Conservation Division on our own 8 motion to permit the operator, Walter J. Cambern, doing 9 business as Cambern and Associates Oil and Gas, Sunwest 10 Bank of Rio Arriba, N.A., and all other interested parties 11 12 to appear and show cause why a certain well in Rio Arriba 13 County, New Mexico, should not be properly plugged and abandoned. 14 At this time I'll call for appearances. 15 MR. CARROLL: Rand Carroll on behalf of the Oil 16 Conservation Division. 17 I have one witness to be sworn. 18 19 EXAMINER STOGNER: Are there any other 20 appearances? There being, none, at this time, Mr. Robinson, 21 22 I'm going to have you sworn in. 23 (Thereupon, the witness was sworn.) EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, Mr. Carroll? 24 25 MR. CARROLL: Thank you.

1 JOHNNY ROBINSON (Present by telephone), the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon 2 his oath, was examined and testified as follows: 3 DIRECT EXAMINATION 4 BY MR. CARROLL 5 Mr. Robinson, will you please state your name 6 7 for the record? My name is Johnny Robinson. 8 Α. 9 Ο. And where do you live? 10 I live in Aztec, New Mexico. Α. And who do you work for, and what is your 11 Q. 12 position with your employer? I've held the position of Field Rep II for 13 Α. 14 approximately six years with the Oil Conservation Division 15 in the Aztec District. Okay, and have you had a chance on prior 16 Q. 17 occasions to testify as to the plugging of wells in the State of New Mexico? 18 Yes, I have. 19 Α. 20 And have your qualifications been accepted as an Q. expert witness in plugging matters? 21 Yes, sir. 22 Α. Mr. Examiner, I offer Mr. Robinson 23 MR. CARROLL: 24 as an expert witness in plugging matters. 25 EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Robinson is so qualified.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, will you please look at what is marked OCD Exhibit Number 1 --
 - A. Okay.

- Q. -- and could you -- We do have a summary on the very first page of Exhibit Number 1. Could you go through the summary and reference any pages in Exhibit 1 which may help the Examiner, and just go through the history of the Smith Number 1 well?
- A. Okay. In the exhibit there's several letters that I've sent out to Cambern and Associates, wanting the well to be brought into compliance, and these wells were never -- never returned anything back to us from the operator. All we got was a bad address.

I called the Texas Railroad Commission and also the Colorado Oil Commission, and neither one of those had any Cambern and Associates.

And then further on in the exhibit there's a permit to drill where the well was approved.

And then on further back is a schematic of the wellbore showing what -- as far as our records, what has been done to the hole, and there's a map showing where it's located and a picture of the existing well.

And the last page is a plugging procedure that's been approved by the Aztec OCD.

Q. Okay, Mr. Robinson, this well was drilled in

1987?

- 2 A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. And the total depth is only 300 feet?
 - A. Right. The well was spudded, and the surface pipe was fed, and they continued to drill until they got to 300 feet, and at that time they discontinued drilling, and it was never completed.
 - Q. Okay. So your recommended plugging procedure is page 13 of Exhibit Number 1? The last page?
 - A. Right.
 - Q. What is the current condition of this well?
 - A. The current condition of the well is, it's standing open, and there has been -- on several different inspections, we've noticed gas bubbling up in the water.

 The fluid level is about a foot from the surface.
 - Q. Okay. So in your opinion, the plugging of this well is necessary at this point to protect public health and the environment?
 - A. Considering where the well, is and it's only about 200 yards from a dwelling, and it could cause a problem with the water well.
 - Q. Okay. Mr. Robinson, is there a bond covering this well?
 - A. Yes, sir, there is a bond.
- Q. And is the information concerning that bond

listed and set forth in Exhibit Number 2?

- A. Yes, sir, there is. I would point out that there's a discrepancy on the location of the well, due to the -- to different surveys.
- Q. Okay. Actually, I saw -- I'm glad you brought that up. I've seen three different unit letters used to describe the location of this well. Which is the correct unit letter?
- A. On page 1, that location, when it was originally applied for, was used by the Martin Border Survey, and now the one on page 5 --
 - Q. Which exhibit are you referring to?
- A. On Exhibit 2 --
- 14 Q. Okay.

- A. -- on the bond. You'll notice on page 1 it's the original bond, and at that time they were using the Martin Border Survey.
 - Q. Okay. And on page 5 --
- A. Right. Then on page 5, in 1987 it was resurveyed, and now they use the Projected New Mexico Primary Meridian Survey.
- Q. Well, it looks like the same location to me on page 1 and page 5 of Exhibit Number 2.
- A. Let's see. Let me find the right one.

 Okay, yeah. Yeah, on the bond, all these bonds

were in 1987, and the survey took place in 1992. So the -Where you would find the correct location is in the sundry
notices themselves.

- Q. Okay. And so that's Unit Letter J; is that correct? The correct location is 1550 from the west line and 660 from the south line? No, 660 from the west line and 1550 from the south?
- A. Right, which would be Unit Letter L, Section 21, 31 North and 3 East.

MR. CARROLL: Okay. Mr. Examiner, I'll bring this to your attention now. The advertisement lists Unit Letter I rather than Unit Letter L. I think there was a mistake in transcription.

EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, since the unit letter is really not a recognizable or a lawful definition for survey, only for our purposes and legal locations, then we can overlook that.

MR. CARROLL: Okay.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, is there anything further in this case you would like to add?
 - A. I can't think of anything else.

MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I also offer what has been -- or refer you to what has been marked OCD Exhibit

Number 3, which is a copy of the notice, and I've also submitted an affidavit regarding the sending of notice to
