Application of Burlington Resources Oil and Gas Company for Compulsory Pooling

Dear Gentlemen:

On October 31, 1997, Total Minatome Corporation ("Total") filed its Second Motion for Stay of the compulsory pooling orders entered in the above-referenced cases. On November 4, 1997, Burlington Resources Oil and Gas Company filed its Response to Total's Motion.

Total claims that Burlington has wrongly rejected Total's tender of its proportionate share of well costs, and therefore has denied Total's rights under the compulsory pooling order. Burlington claims that Total has failed to make a proper and timely election to participate pursuant to the compulsory pooling order.

The Division and the Commission will not determine whether elections have been timely and properly made or wrongly rejected. These issues are issues for the courts to resolve if the entities cannot do so themselves. The issues raised do not constitute grounds for staying compulsory pooling orders.

Total's Second Motion for Stay of the compulsory pooling orders is denied.
