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5	EXAMINER CATANACH: Okay, at this time I will
6	call Case 11,813, which is the Application of the Oil
7	Conservation for an order requiring Geo Engineering,
8	Incorporated, to plug 45 wells in McKinley County, New
9	Mexico.
10	I will call for appearances at this time.
11	MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, my name is Rand
12	Carroll, appearing on behalf of the Oil Conservation
13	Division.
14	I have one witness to be sworn.
15	EXAMINER CATANACH: Call for additional
16	appearances.
17	Let the record show that there are no additional
18	parties present in the hearing room.
19	Mr. Robinson, can I get you to stand and raise
20	your right hand to be sworn in at this time?
21	MR. ROBINSON: Okay.
22	(Thereupon, the witness was sworn.)
23	EXAMINER CATANACH: Okay, Mr. Carroll, you may
24	proceed.
25	MR. CARROLL: Thank you.

JOHNNY ROBINSON (Present by Telephone), 1 the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon 2 his oath, was examined and testified as follows: 3 DIRECT EXAMINATION 4 BY MR. CARROLL: 5 Mr. Robinson, will you please state your name, 6 your employer and your position with your employer for the 7 record? 8 9 Α. My name is Johnny Robinson. I work for the State Oil Conservation. I'm a Field Rep 2 in the Aztec District. 10 Mr. Robinson, do your duties as a Field Rep 2 11 12 include the location and supervising of the plugging of abandoned wells? 13 Yes, it does. 14 Α. Mr. Robinson, are you familiar with the subject 15 matter of this Application dealing with Case 11,813 and Geo 16 17 Engineering, Inc.? 18 Α. Yes, I am. And have you testified before the Oil 19 20 Conservation Division before regarding the plugging of abandoned wells? 21 A. Yes, I have. 22 MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I tender Mr. Robinson 23 as qualified. 24

EXAMINER CATANACH: Mr. Robinson is so qualified.

Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, can you refer to
the well filed for the Santa Fe Pacific Number 1 and the
Santa Fe Pacific Number 19, which have been marked as OCD
Exhibits 1 and 2?

MR. CARROLL: And Mr. Examiner, I'll ask at this
time for permission to, instead of going through all 45
wells, use these two wells as -- and Mr. Robinson will

EXAMINER CATANACH: Yes, you may do so Mr.

testify that they are representative of all 45 wells.

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- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, are the wells named Santa Fe Pacific Number 1 and Number 19 representative of the 45 wells that are the subject matter of this hearing?
- A. Yes, sir, they are.
- Q. Okay. Will you please go through what has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 1, which is the Santa Fe Pacific 1 well file and give us a brief history of the well?
- A. Brief history is, they drilled the well with a 20 6 3/4 bit down to 316 feet.
 - Q. When did they do this?
- 22 A. February 5th, 1975.
- 23 Q. Okay.
- A. They cemented the casing with ten sacks of cement. And it was an open-hole completion from 306 to

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And the fourth month of 1975, they tested the well, and it made five barrels of oil and 20 barrels of water.

And since that -- Since 1975 I don't show anything else.

- Q. So Mr. Robinson, the target formation was that shallow?
 - A. Right, yes, sir.
- Q. Can you refer to what has been marked OCD Exhibit

 Number 2, which is the Santa Fe Pacific Number 19 well, and
 do the same facts apply to that well?
 - A. Yes, sir. Basically it's about the same. It's a little bit deeper, is the only difference.
 - Q. And are the other 43 wells similar? Drilled to about the same depth, drilled at the same time and the same operations performed on them?
 - A. Yes, they are.
- Q. What is the current condition of all these 45 wells?
 - A. These wells are shut in at this time.
 - Q. And in order to protect public health and the environment, prevent waste and protect correlative rights, are they in need of plugging at this time?
 - A. Yes, they are.

- Q. Have you prepared a plugging procedure?
- A. Yes, sir, we have a plugging procedure that had two different procedures. One is a rigless procedure where we just hook onto the tubing and determine whether there's any holes in that casing and determine if we can get cement down to the perforations, and we do it with a rigless completion.
- Q. What would you estimate to be the cost of plugging these wells?
 - A. On the rigless, probably around \$800 apiece.
 - Q. And if a rig is required?

- A. With a rig it's kind of hard to say, because if we have to move a rig on we may have to clean out the casing, and depending on what we find inside the casing it could run anywhere from \$3000 to \$8000.
- MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, the plugging procedures for both the rigless and the rig plugging are contained in OCD Exhibit Number 4.
- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, have you been in contact with the operator of these wells?
 - A. No, sir, there's no operator available.
- Q. What do you mean, there's no operator? We have a Geo Engineering, Inc., listed as operator.
- A. Well, I mean, there's no one to get ahold of. As
 I understand it, they're deceased or gone.

Who is the principal of Geo? Do you recall? 1 0. 2 No, I don't. 3 Okay. But you've attempted to contact Geo Q. Engineering or their principals, and you've had no luck? 4 Α. Right. Ernest sent some letters to the operator 5 6 and never got any response. 7 0. Were the letters returned as undeliverable? I'm reading his letter here, and I don't see it 8 Α. in it, and I would imagine that was the case. Okay. Mr. Robinson, are you aware of any bond, 10 Q. plugging bond, that covers these wells? 11 There's a \$50,000 bond that's in place for Red 12 Α. 13 Mountain. There's a -- He found a C-104 that changes the 14 15 ownership from Geo to Red Mountain in 1984. I believe you've got it switched, you've got them 16 Q. 17 backwards. 18 Oh, okay. Α. The C-104 changes the operator name from Red 19 20 Mountain Associates to Geo Engineering, Inc. Oh, I see, he's got two bonds here, one for Red 21 Mountain and the another for Geo, that's right. 22 23 MR. CARROLL: Right. And Mr. Examiner, if I could direct your 24

attention to what has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 3,

which is the \$50,000 blanket plugging bond in the name of Geo Engineering, Inc.

And Mr. Examiner, at this time I will refer you also to what has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 5, which is the affidavit of notice for this case.

Notice was sent to Geo Engineering, Inc., and
American Manufacturers Mutual Insurance, the surety on the
plugging bond.

We did receive a receipt from American

Manufacturers and have not received a receipt or a letter

returned as undeliverable for Geo Engineering, Inc. The

address we have for Geo Engineering, Inc., the last known

address, is P.O. Box 2966, here in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, at this time do you recommend that these -- all 45 wells be plugged in order to protect public health and the environment or prevent waste or protect correlative rights?
 - A. Yes, I do.

- Q. Do you have anything further to add at this time?
- A. No, I can't think of anything.

MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, I would ask that what has been marked OCD Exhibits Numbers 1 through 5 be admitted into the record.

EXAMINER CATANACH: Exhibits 1 through 5 will be admitted as evidence in this case.

10 **EXAMINATION** 1 2 BY EXAMINER CATANACH: Mr. Robinson, are you aware that there were 3 waterflood operations conducted out there at one time? 4 5 Α. No, I'm not. I was just noticing on one of the -- on your 6 Exhibit Number 2, on the C-101, at the bottom there is a 7 note from -- I presume it was written in by Frank Chavez, 9 who says, "WFX required before injection". So it appears that there may have been some sort 10 of water injection project out there at one time or 11 12 another. I know there is a lease right next to it that's 13 Α. 14 owned by InterDyne, and I know he has plans for a 15 waterflood. Q. Okay. As a matter of fact, that is an attachment 16 17 to your Exhibit Number 2 where Geo Engineering was authorized to inject into the Menefee formation and I guess 18 several wells which are entitled Chaco Wash Mesaverde 19 wells. 20 Just for the record. I don't have any questions 21 on it; I was just noting that for the record. 22 You're not aware of any waterflow situations at 23

this point in that field, are you, Mr. Robinson?

No, I'm not.

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1	Q. Are most of these wells Have you been out
2	there?
3	A. I was out there one day and looked at six or
4	seven wells.
5	Q. All right, are they The ones you looked at,
6	are they just open to the atmosphere?
7	A. No, most of them are they have plugs or
8	something in them.
9	Q. Do they have wellheads on them?
10	A. Yeah, they have tubing sticking up with a bull
11	plugger.
12	EXAMINER CATANACH: Okay. For the record, I
13	would just like to say that the I believe the principal
14	of this company, of Geo Engineering, Inc., was a gentleman
15	named Jim Law, who I was acquainted with. He actually
16	presented a case or two in Santa Fe, I believe, during the
17	last part of the 1980s.
18	It's my understanding that Mr. Law has passed
19	away several years ago, and I don't know that there were
20	any other principals with his company, so that's just for
21	the record.
22	I have no further questions of this witness at
23	this time.
24	Mr. Carroll, do you have anything further in this
25	case?

1	MR. CARROLL: I have nothing further in this
2	case.
3	EXAMINER CATANACH: Okay, there being nothing
4	further in this case, Case 11,813 will be taken under
5	advisement.
6	And this hearing is adjourned.
