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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 9:05 a.m. 2 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, we'll get started 3 I think this will be a very short meeting of the 4 5 Commission. It's September 10th, 1998. We have all three 6 Commissioners present. I don't think there's really any 7 reason for introductions today, it looks like. Everybody 8 here knows everybody. 9 We do, let's see, have a few items of business to take care of, and I guess one matter to act upon. 10 11 First of all, the minutes of the hearing of the 12 Oil Conservation Commission held on July 16th, 1998, 13 there's a copy of the draft minutes in your notebooks, Commissioners. 14 15 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Madam Chair, I propose 16 acceptance of the minutes. 17 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I second. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: 18 All in favor say "aye". COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Aye. 19 20 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 21 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Those minutes are approved. 22 Florene, do you have a copy for me to sign? 23 MS. DAVIDSON: Yes. 24 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, I'll sign those 25 momentarily.

We also have the minutes of the brief hearing of 1 the Oil Conservation Commission held on July 30th, 1998. 2 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move we accept those 3 minutes. 4 5 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Second. I wasn't there, but I'll still second. 6 7 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: All in favor say "aye". 8 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. 9 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Aye. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay. 10 And likewise, I'll 11 sign those here shortly. We had a few cases that were on the docket for 12 13 today that have either been dismissed or postponed. 14 The first one of these was Case 11,992. This was 15 the Application of Penwell Energy, Inc., for compulsory 16 pooling in Eddy County, New Mexico. 17 Upon application of Canadian Kenwood Company, 18 this case was set to be heard de novo. We subsequently 19 received a letter from the de novo Applicant in the case, 20 Canadian Kenwood Company, requesting that the matter be 21 dismissed, and there is a letter in your notebooks, 22 Commissioners, dismissing the matter pursuant to the 23 request of the de novo Applicant. 24 In addition, Case 11,839 -- this is the 25 Application of Odessa Oil Investments, Inc., for saltwater

disposal in Eddy County, New Mexico -- the de novo 1 Applicant in this case, Odessa Oil Investments, Inc., has 2 requested that this matter be continued to the November 3 hearing. 4 5 I might just note right now that we'll probably be getting back in touch with you, because I have a 6 7 conflict that week of November 12th, and so depending on how the docket shapes up, we may either skip that meeting 8 9 and hear the items that are scheduled for November in 10 December, or try to reschedule that meeting, if we can work something out that fits everybody's schedule. I just 11 12 wanted to give you a heads-up on that. This is -- Mark 13 Ashley and Rand Carroll and I are talking about going to the -- attend the Judicial College --14 15 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: That's a good one. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- that week --16 17 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: I hope you do that --18 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- so --19 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: -- that's an excellent --20 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- that's why we might need 21 to schedule that particular meeting. 22 Let's see. Then we had four cases -- oh -- Yeah, 23 I'll go ahead and mention, we had four cases, Case 11,935,

11,936, 11,937 and 11,938. These were Applications of

Chevron USA Production Company for reinstatement of

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underproduction in various wells in the Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Gas Pool in Eddy County, New Mexico.

The de novo Applicant in this case, Chevron USA

Production Company, has requested that these cases be

dismissed, and I believe Florene gave you this morning a

copy of a letter dismissing these matters at the request of

the de novo Applicant, so that took care of those four

cases that were on our docket.
