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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:05 a.m.

CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: This is the October 15th, 1998, meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.

We are doing this meeting a little bit differently today because we've got a very short agenda. We have Commissioner Bill LeMay, and we also have Jami Bailey representing Commissioner Ray Powell, participating in this meeting over the telephone, and it sounds like we've got a good connection, so this should be able to work for all of us.

In the room here at the OCD offices we've got
Lori Wrotenbery, Commission Chairman; Lyn Hebert, the
Commission's legal counsel; Florene Davidson, the
Commission Secretary; and Steve Brenner is here to record
the meeting.

We had several items on the agenda for today, but as has happened at a number of our meetings over the last few months, all of the cases were either continued or dismissed. And let me just give you a rundown on those quickly.

We had Case Number 12,003; this was the

Application of Manzano Oil Corporation for special Pool

Rules in Lea County, New Mexico. This case was going to be

heard de novo at the request of the Applicant, Manzano Oil Corporation. Manzano has asked that this matter be continued to November.

We also had three related cases.

The first one was Case 11,958, the Application of Ocean Energy, Inc., for compulsory pooling and an unorthodox well location in Lea County, New Mexico. Upon the Application of Ocean Energy Resources, Inc., this case was going to be heard de novo, and Ocean Energy has asked that the case be continued to November.

We also had Case 11,959, another Application of Ocean Energy, Inc., for compulsory pooling in Lea County, New Mexico. Again, this case was going to be heard de novo on the Application of Ocean Energy, Inc., but Ocean Energy has requested that we continue the case to November.

Case 11,934 is the Application of Yates Petroleum Corporation for compulsory pooling in Lea County, New Mexico. This case was to be heard *de novo* upon the request of Ocean Energy, Inc., and the parties have asked that this case be continued to November.

Then we had a couple of cases that are being dismissed.

Case 11,985, the Application of Saga Petroleum,
L.L.C., for an unorthodox well location in Eddy County, New
Mexico. This case was to be heard de novo upon request of

Saga Petroleum, and we received a request on October 6th 1 from Saga Petroleum to dismiss this case. And I have 2 written a letter confirming that the case -- the de novo 3 case has been dismissed, and that Division Order Number 4 R-11,048 is continued in full force and effect. 5 And then finally we had Case Number 12,059. 6 This was the Application of Saga Petroleum, L.L.C., for 7 compulsory pooling in Eddy County, New Mexico. 8 9 particular case had not yet been heard by the Division, but 10 the parties had asked that it be brought directly to the Commission so it could be consolidated with the other Saga 11 12 Petroleum case that we just dismissed. But we have now received a letter --13 MS. DAVIDSON: It's not in there. 14 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Oh, It's not in there? 15 16 MS. DAVIDSON: It was yesterday. 17 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Oh, okay. We have received a request, though --18 MS. DAVIDSON: 19 Right. 20 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- from the parties 21 involved in this particular matter to dismiss the 22 Application. And Florene has drafted up an order of the Commission dismissing the case at the request of Saga 23 24 Petroleum, L.L.C. Since we didn't have a Division order in 25 this case, we have gone ahead and put this in the form of a

Commission order. 1 If the other Commissioners agree, I will go ahead 2 and sign this particular order and just make a note that 3 you have agreed at this meeting that we're conducting using 4 the telephone. 5 6 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Bill Lemay, I agree. COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Jami Bailey, I agree. 7 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, that sounds good. 8 So I can just sign this, Lyn? Do I need -- What 9 kind of note do I need to make, since we're doing this --10 MS. HEBERT: Florene can just type in "approved 11 telephonically" and the date by each of their names. 12 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, did you hear that, 13 Bill and Jami? 14 15 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Yes, I sure did. COMMISSIONER LEMAY: Yes. 16 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Fine with me. 17 18 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, we'll do it that way. COMMISSIONER LEMAY: 19 Good. 20 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Let me sign my name here. 21 Okay, thank you. So the main reason that we needed to visit today 22 is to set a hearing date for November. We've got several 23 requests to schedule hearings in November. I do have a 24 conflict with the initial hearing date, which was set for 25

the 12th. I'll be out of town on that date, and so I 1 2 wanted to touch base with the two of you and see if we could find another date in November. 3 4 What I was looking at is the possibility of 5 meeting in the third week of November, the week of the 16th. 6 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: That would be fine with me. 7 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: The 17th and 19th are not 8 9 good for me, but 16, 18 or 20 is good. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: 16, 18 or 20. Let me check 10 something. All of those dates are good with me too. 11 anybody have a preference? 12 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: How about the 16th or 18th? 13 Fridays are always difficult. 14 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, shall we set it for 15 the 18th? 16 17 MS. DAVIDSON: Sounds good. CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: 18 Okay. 19 COMMISSIONER LEMAY: The 18th is fine. 20 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Fine with me. 21 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Great. Then the next 22 meeting -- Oh, I'm sorry, Florene? 23 MS. DAVIDSON: That is the day before the 24 Examiner Hearing, in case it might go over, in case all of 25 these cases go on, it might be more than one day, but...

1	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Well, if that did come
2	about, then we would just continue the hearing, maybe
3	MS. DAVIDSON: Yes.
4	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: to Friday or another
5	date
6	MS. DAVIDSON: Right, that should be

8	convenience.
9	MS. DAVIDSON: That can be done.
10	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay.
11	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: What about Monday, going on
12	to Wednesday?
13	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: That's good with me too.
14	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: That's fine with me, Monday
15	the 16th?
16	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, we'll do that, just
17	we'll have that cushion then.
18	COMMISSIONER LEMAY: We have the cushion on the
19	18th.
20	CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Yes. Okay, so the next
21	meeting of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission will
22	be held on Monday, November 16th. Great.
23	Is there any other business we need to discuss
24	today?
