Case 1.553: Application of Burlington Resources Oil & Gas Company for an unorthodox coal-gas well location, San Juan County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks approval to drill its proposed Farmington A Well No. 100 at an unorthodox coal-gas well location ("off-pattern") 660 feet from the south line and 705 feet from the east line of Section 1, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, to be dedicated to a standard 320-acre gas spacing unit consisting of the S/2 of this section for any and all coal-gas production within the limits of the Basin Fruitland Coal Gas Pool. This well is located within the City of Farmington, New Mexico.

APPLICATION

Comes now BURLINGTON RESOURCES OIL & GAS COMPANY, ("Burlington") by and through its attorneys. Kellahin and Kellahin, and applies to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for approval of an unorthodox well location ("OFF-PATTERN") in the Basin Fruitland Coal Gas Pool for its proposed Farmington A Well No. 100 to be drilled at an unorthodox well location 660 feet from the south line and 705 feet from the east line of Section 1. T29N, R13W, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, and to be dedicated to a 320 acre spacing unit consisting of the S/2 of Section 1, and in support states:

- (1) Burlington is the proposed operator of this well.
- (2) Burlington seeks to drill its Farmington A Well No. 100 in the Basin Fruitland Coal Gas Pool at an unorthodox location 660 feet from the south line and 705 feet from the east line (Unit P) of Section 1, T29N, R13W, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.
- (3) The proposed location is standard as to the footage requirements but is unorthodox in that it is "off-pattern" for the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool because it is located in the SE/4 of the section rather than either the NE/4 or the SW/4 of the section.

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(4) The proposed "off pattern" location is topographically necessary because most of Section 1 is within the City of Farmington and there are no existing wellbore which

can be used for a coal gas well.

(5) No correlative rights will be impaired by approving this application.

(6) Burlington requests that this matter be docketed for hearing on the Division

Examiner docket now scheduled for December 7, 2000.

(7) In accordance with Division notice rules, copies of this application will be sent

to all of the persons affected by this application as set forth on Exhibit "A" attached.

WHEREFORE, Burlington Resources Oil & Gas Company requests that this

matter be set for hearing on December 7, 2000 before a duly appointed Examiner of the

Oil Conservation Division and that after notice and hearing as required by law, the

Division enter its order granting this application.
