Our office has received the April 2<sup>nd</sup> letter from Gailen Hooper and the April 3<sup>rd</sup> letter from Bruce and Darlene Herberger (the conservators for Alan Edward Herberger) addressed to the Division. These parties object to Nearburg's application solely on the grounds that their overriding royalty interest has allegedly been incorrectly identified in Nearburg's Exhibit C.

Range 24 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico.

Nearburg's land department has contacted Mr. Hooper and the conservators for Alan Edward Herberger and has assured them that the questions concerning their calculated overriding royalty interest will be submitted to Nearburg's title attorney for resolution. Further, Nearburg anticipates acquiring Chevron's working interest and will allocate a correctly calculated overriding royalty interest on a pro-rata basis to the proposed S/2 spacing unit.

The royalty issue Mr. Hooper and the conservators raise in their letters does not require a Division hearing in this matter. The nature and extent of the override held by these parties is a matter of contract that will be shortly sorted out. The Division does not have jurisdiction over this contractual matter and any order resulting from this application will not address the nature and extend of these overrides. In short, the contractual issue raised by these two letters

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does not and cannot provide a basis for denying Nearburg's application for administrative approval of an unorthodox well location.

Nearburg respectfully requests that its administrative application be granted since no other party has objected and the basis for the existing objections involves a contractual matter over which the Division does not have jurisdiction.
