Brenner, Certified Court Reporter No. 7 for the State of New Mexico.

1 WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at
2 8:30 a.m.:

3 EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I will call Case
4 Number 12,379, which is the Application of the New Mexico
5 Oil Conservation Division for an order requiring operators
6 to bring 119 wells into compliance with Rule 201.B and
7 assessing appropriate civil penalties for wells in San
8 Juan, Rio Arriba, Sandoval and McKinley Counties, New
9 Mexico.

10 Call for appearances.

11 MR. BROOKS: May it please the Examiner, I'm
12 David Brooks, Assistant General Counsel, Department of
13 Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources, appearing on behalf
14 of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division.

15 EXAMINER STOGNER: Any other appearances?

16 MR. HALL: Mr. Examiner, Scott Hall from the
17 Miller Stratvert Torgerson law firm, Santa Fe, entering an
18 appearance on behalf of Central Resources, Incorporated.
19 No witnesses this morning, Mr. Examiner.

20 MR. BROOKS: And I have two witnesses, Mr.
21 Examiner.

22 EXAMINER STOGNER: That's Central Resources?

23 MR. HALL: Yes, after the presentation of Mr.
24 Brooks' case I'll explain the circumstances behind my
25 evidence at this point.

1 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, if there's no other
2 appearances, will the witnesses --

3 MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner --

4 EXAMINER STOGNER: Oh, I'm sorry.

5 MR. BRUCE: -- Jim Bruce, I'm entering an
6 appearance on behalf of NM&O Operating Company, or I had
7 previously entered an appearance. I understand that with
8 respect to my client the case is being continued. Thank
9 you.

10 EXAMINER STOGNER: Correction, that portion of
11 the case will be continued.

12 MR. BRUCE: That portion.

13 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, I've got NM&O, Central
14 Resources and OCD. Any other appearances?

15 Okay, at this time will all witnesses please
16 stand to be sworn?

17 (Thereupon, the witnesses were sworn.)

18 MR. BROOKS: Your Honor, I would like to make a
19 brief statement, and in view of what I'm going to say it
20 may change the way in which we proceed. So may I proceed
21 with my statement?

22 EXAMINER STOGNER: Please.

23 MR. BROOKS: Okay. First off, your Honor, we
24 brought this Application against a very large number of
25 operators, I think about 13 operators. And in accordance

1 with the way the inactive well project has proceeded
2 heretofore in the Division, our policy has been to send out
3 letters to all of the operators who have inactive wells,
4 and most of the operators throughout have corrected these
5 problems.

6 However, we have proceeded to file an Application
7 against those with whom it was impossible to establish
8 communication for whatever reason. And in this case it
9 ended up being it looks like about 20 operators, 19
10 operators, that we named in the Application which I filed.

11 Of these, the personnel of District 3 has
12 succeeded in establishing contact with 12 of these
13 operators -- or with 18 of these operators, and it's my
14 understanding that each of these operators has committed to
15 a specific plan to bring their wells into compliance.

16 We are therefore requesting at this time that the
17 hearing be continued -- Well, first of all, there are
18 certain operators as to which we are requesting a
19 dismissal. And in the case -- as to the following
20 operators we are requesting dismissal of the proceeding:

21 Paragraph Number 7 of the Application deals with
22 Julius Chodorow. We are requesting that the Application be
23 dismissed as to Mr. Chodorow. We believe that Mr. Chodorow
24 is not active any longer and that it will be necessary
25 eventually to plug those wells. However, those wells are

1 located on tribal lands -- that well, it's one well, is
2 located on tribal lands, and at this time we do not have an
3 agreement with the tribe as to the appropriate means of
4 disposition, and therefore we are not in a position to
5 proceed as to that well, and we will dismiss that, of
6 course, without prejudice to our subsequently bringing a
7 plugging action with regards to that well.

8 We are also requesting dismissal as to Tasco, as
9 the paragraph 17 of the Application, has eight wells, and
10 the situation with Tasco is that there is a series of
11 questions about who actually is presently responsible for
12 those wells, and therefore we're not in a position to
13 proceed with respect to those wells and to determine the
14 appropriate disposition.

15 We are also requesting dismissal as to Keystone
16 Energy, LLC, that is the subject of paragraph 8, and they
17 have one well. And I believe that is a similar situation
18 to the situation with Tasco, that there is a question of
19 the status of their lease which cannot be solved within the
20 parameters of this proceeding.

21 Am I missing anybody, Mr. Chavez, that we're
22 dismissing?

23 MR. CHAVEZ: I can't think of anyone at this
24 time, no.

25 MR. BROOKS: I believe that is the ones that

1 we're dismissing.

2 As to the remaining operators, with the exception
3 of Coulthurst Management and Investment, Inc., Coulthurst
4 Management and Investment, Inc., is the subject of
5 paragraph 3 of the Application, as to all of the remaining
6 operators except Coulthurst and the ones we have previously
7 stated we're dismissing, we are requesting that this
8 hearing be continued on our request for a compliance order
9 until the second hearing in January. And I'm sorry, I do
10 not have the date of that hearing. It will be the second
11 Examiner Hearing in the month of January, 2002.

12 This will give those operators a period of
13 approximately 90 days within which to comply with the plans
14 which they have provided to supervisor Chavez, and if they
15 do not do so, we will then proceed to ask the Examiner to
16 enter a compliance order as to those who do not. But at
17 this time we would ask for a severance of the proceeding as
18 to those people so that we can continue it for that
19 purpose.

20 Now, at this time I will call your attention to
21 the exhibit folder, because there is an issue with regard
22 to the remaining respondent Coulthurst Management and
23 Investment, Inc., which is somewhat complicated. And
24 because one of the documents in here might be construed as
25 a request for continuance, I wanted to bring it to your

1 Honor's attention so that you can direct us as to how we
2 should proceed.

3 I discussed this issue with Supervisor Chavez
4 yesterday, and we concluded that we would ask to proceed
5 for a compliance against them. However, your Honor may
6 feel that a request for continuance has been presented and
7 should be considered.

8 For this reason, I will call your attention to
9 Exhibit Number 6 in the examination folder. Exhibit Number
10 6 appears to be and will be identified by my witness as a
11 fax which was sent to our Aztec District Office by
12 Coulthurst on October the 16th, 2001, the day before
13 yesterday. And I'll give you a moment to read it, and then
14 I will comment briefly on what I believe the evidence will
15 show as to the background of this letter.

16 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay.

17 MR. BROOKS: Are you ready for me to proceed?

18 EXAMINER STOGNER: Let's -- Just for the record,
19 this will be a severed case. What we will consider today
20 are the dismissals concerning the Julius Chodorow, Tasco
21 and the Keystone Energy-operated wells. We will hear
22 testimony concerning the wells that are being operated
23 under Coulthurst Management, and all of the other wells and
24 operators for this case will be continued to the second
25 hearing in January. And I'm sorry, I can't remember if

1 that's the third or fourth Thursday of that month. I have
2 it written upstairs, and we will make a note of that for
3 the record before the day is over.

4 With that, I'll let you proceed, Mr. Brooks.

5 MR. BROOKS: Okay. What I believe the evidence
6 will show, your Honor, as to the background of this letter
7 is that the District Office has on numerous occasions
8 attempted to communicate with Coulthurst and has done so at
9 the address 1990 Main Avenue, Berkeley, California 94707,
10 which is the address appearing on the letterhead of the
11 fax, which is Exhibit 6, that was sent the day before
12 yesterday.

13 The District's certified mailings to that address
14 have been returned unclaimed. The notice of this hearing
15 was sent to that same address by certified mail, return
16 receipt requested, by myself, as evidenced by my affidavit
17 which I intend to file as Exhibit 2, and we have neither
18 received the return receipt, nor have we received the
19 returned envelope. So we do not know what has happened to
20 the notice.

21 Our reason for requesting to proceed at this time
22 is that it seems to us that Coulthurst has been, at the
23 very least, rather negligent in not receiving its
24 communications at what apparently is its current address,
25 and their statement in Exhibit Number 6 that they've had

1 only 24 hours' notice, and accordingly they request 30
2 days' continuance of what they refer to as "the meeting",
3 so they obviously misunderstand the nature of this
4 proceeding, would seem to me to be somewhat disingenuous in
5 view of their failure or refusal to accept the Division's
6 mailings.

7 However, I call this to your attention before
8 presenting my evidence in case your Honor construes this as
9 a request for a continuance which you are disposed to
10 grant.

11 Thank you.

12 EXAMINER STOGNER: No, I'm not going to consider
13 this a request for continuance at this time. I'd like for
14 you to go ahead and proceed, and perhaps after we hear the
15 testimony I'll make the decision at that time.

16 MR. BROOKS: Very good. The Division will call
17 Mr. Frank Chavez.

18 May I proceed?

19 EXAMINER STOGNER: Please.

20 FRANK T. CHAVEZ,
21 the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon
22 his oath, was examined and testified as follows:

23 DIRECT EXAMINATION

24 BY MR. BROOKS:

25 Q. Would you state your name for the record, please?

1 A. My name is Frank Chavez.

2 Q. And where do you reside?

3 A. I reside in Aztec, New Mexico.

4 Q. And how are you employed?

5 A. I'm the District Supervisor for the Oil
6 Conservation Division District 3 Office in Aztec.

7 Q. And in that capacity are you the person who is
8 responsible for the administration of the District's
9 regulation of oil and gas in District 3?

10 A. Yes, I am.

11 Q. And what counties does District 3 include?

12 A. District 3 includes San Juan, Rio Arriba,
13 Sandoval and McKinley Counties.

14 Q. Okay. Mr. Chavez, have you been involved in what
15 has been referred to in previous proceedings as the
16 inactive well project that is being conducted by the
17 Division?

18 A. Yes, I have.

19 Q. And would you briefly review for the Examiner how
20 you have proceeded in regard to the inactive well project,
21 what your function has been?

22 A. In the District we've been responsible for
23 following on notifying operators of wells that have been
24 out of compliance with Oil Conservation Division Rules and
25 Regulations, wells that have been inactive and not in

1 compliance with the temporary abandonment rules, or wells
2 for which operators have not filed production reports,
3 C-115s, as are required by OCD Regulations.

4 We sent an initial mailing out to operators who
5 had met those criteria of having inactive wells or
6 unreported wells in May of the year 2000. We received
7 responses back, but in September of year 2000 we sent
8 letters to those operators who hadn't responded to the May
9 mailing.

10 The purpose of bringing Coulthurst for this
11 particular hearing is that they did not respond to the May
12 mailing, nor did they accept the September 25th letter that
13 we sent to them concerning their response to the initial
14 mailing.

15 Q. Okay. To clarify for the purposes of the record
16 and the Examiner's understanding of this, there was a mass
17 mailing mailed out in May -- approximately May 11th, 2000;
18 is that correct?

19 A. I think that's correct.

20 Q. And was that mailed from the Santa Fe office?

21 A. Yes, it was.

22 Q. And was Jane Prouty responsible for generating
23 the list of people to whom that was to be mailed?

24 A. That's correct.

25 Q. Okay, Ms. Prouty will be our next witness, and I

1 will go into that with her. But then you were notified as
2 to the people to whom that mailing had been sent, correct?

3 A. That's correct, we received a list of the
4 operators that had been notified and a list of wells that
5 met those criteria.

6 Q. Very good. And one of the operators to whom that
7 notice was sent was Coulthurst Management and Investment,
8 Inc., correct?

9 A. That's correct.

10 Q. And did you receive any reply to that May 11th,
11 2000, letter from Coulthurst Management and Investment,
12 Inc.?

13 A. No, we did not.

14 Q. Okay. Now, would you look at your exhibit stack,
15 and I will call your attention to what has been marked as
16 OCD Exhibit 3, and ask you to identify it.

17 A. Is it this one?

18 Q. Yes. Your exhibits -- you don't have a marked --

19 A. I don't have the numbers.

20 Q. -- marked set of exhibits. Let me get you a
21 marked set of exhibits.

22 A. Thank you.

23 Q. That's all Exhibit 1, so just go on to the next
24 one. There we go.

25 A. Exhibit Number 3 is a copy of a certified mail,

1 return receipt requested, letter that my office sent to
2 Coulthurst Management and Investment Company on September
3 25th of the year 2000.

4 Q. Okay, and I will call your attention to the
5 address. Would you read into the record the address to
6 which that was sent?

7 A. The address is 1990, Marin Avenue, Berkeley,
8 California 94707.

9 Q. Okay. Now I will call your attention to what has
10 been marked as Exhibit 4 and ask if you can identify it.

11 A. This is a copy of the envelope that this letter
12 was sent in as it was returned to our office.

13 Q. Okay. And we'll note for the record that Exhibit
14 Number 4 has what appears to be a postal stamp that says
15 "Returned to Sender", and below that the stamp says "Reason
16 Checked", and of the various reasons that are given on the
17 stamp the one that is checkmarked is "Unclaimed".

18 Now, Mr. Chavez, did you ever receive any further
19 correspondence from Coulthurst regarding the inactive well
20 project up to this week?

21 A. No, we did not.

22 Q. And this week, after this Application had been
23 filed, did you attempt to contact Coulthurst?

24 A. Yes, Mr. Perrin from my office made several
25 attempts through different channels and was finally able to

1 contact Mr. Coulthurst by telephone.

2 Q. Okay, I will call your attention to what has been
3 marked as OCD Exhibit Number 5 and ask you if you can
4 identify it.

5 A. This is a faxed, handwritten memorandum that was
6 sent to Mr. Perrin in my office in response to his
7 telephone contact. It was sent by Mr. Coulthurst.

8 Q. I note that Exhibit Number 5 is dated 10/16,
9 without any year. Can you tell me what year that this was
10 received?

11 A. It's this year.

12 Q. So that was 10-16 of 01?

13 A. That's correct.

14 Q. Which would have been the day before yesterday?

15 A. Yes. In looking at this we noticed also, we
16 can't take into consideration the date at the top of the
17 fax. Their machine is apparently not programmed correctly
18 with the right times and dates.

19 Q. Yes, I will note that the fax machine says
20 "01/22/1995", or is it 1998? I don't have my glasses?

21 A. 1995.

22 Q. Okay. Well, this was not, in fact, received in
23 1995?

24 A. No, it was not.

25 Q. Very good. Okay, let me call your attention next

1 to what has been marked as OCD Exhibit 6 and ask you if you
2 can identify it.

3 A. This is a copy of the fax that we received in our
4 office addressed to Mr. Perrin in further response to the
5 phone call that he had made.

6 Q. Okay, and this is dated October 16, 2001,
7 correct? Again, Tuesday of this week?

8 A. Yes, it is there at the -- just above the
9 greeting on the --

10 Q. And again, the fax stamp indicates that it was
11 sent on "01/22/1995"?

12 A. That's right.

13 Q. And that is not correct as to when it was sent?

14 A. No, it's not.

15 Q. Thank you. Now, did you cause a physical
16 inspection to be made of the Coulthurst wells that are
17 included in this Application?

18 A. Yes, yes, we did.

19 Q. I will call your attention to what has been
20 marked as OCD Exhibit 7 through 18, and of course these are
21 Xerox copies of color pictures, and they may be a little
22 hard to identify, but -- some of them, but I will ask you
23 if you can identify those pictures.

24 A. Yes, these are copies of photos of the wells that
25 are the subject of this Application for Coulthurst.

1 Q. Thank you. And I will note that the Examiner has
2 been furnished with the originals, the color photographs
3 that are not Xerox copies.

4 Is each of these photographs labeled with a label
5 in rather large type showing the well to which it relates
6 by well name, number and API number?

7 A. Yes, on the copies it's not very clear but it
8 should be very clear on the originals.

9 Q. Okay. And these -- unlike some Division
10 photographs, these do not have dates imprinted on them by
11 the camera. Can you tell me approximately when these
12 photographs, Exhibits 7 through 18, were taken?

13 A. They would have -- I'm sorry, I can't. It's done
14 by a field inspection staff, and I don't recall the date
15 they went out. It's been within the last month.

16 Q. It would have been since the filing of this
17 Application?

18 A. That's correct.

19 Q. And this Application was filed on September the
20 27th, 2001?

21 A. Yes, sir.

22 Q. So it would have been sometime since that date
23 and prior to today, correct?

24 A. Yes, sir.

25 MR. BROOKS: Okay. I'll move for the admission

1 of OCD Exhibits 3 through 18.

2 EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibits 3 through 18 will be
3 admitted into evidence at this time.

4 MR. BROOKS: And I'll pass the witness.

5 EXAMINATION

6 BY EXAMINER STOGNER:

7 Q. Mr. Chavez, in referring to Exhibit Number 6, up
8 there at the top in the text it says "Dear Charlie, Thank
9 you for your call and e-mail which were received about 4 PM
10 Friday, Oct. 12th." What e-mail is he referring to that
11 was sent on October the 12th?

12 A. My recollection is -- I'm sorry, I don't have a
13 copy of that. In Mr. Perrin's communication with Mr.
14 Coulthurst, he did send him copies or a list of the wells
15 that we referred to, we're referring to, and I think some
16 other communications, but I'm not real sure. He is present
17 and he can be able to tell you exactly what that e-mail
18 communication included.

19 Q. Are you referring to previous -- Okay, you've
20 already stated in your testimony today about a mass mailing
21 of May 11th, and of course Exhibit Number 3 contains a
22 September 25th of 2000 letter. Are there any other
23 additional correspondence --

24 A. Just --

25 Q. -- that would have been contained in that e-mail

1 that you know of?

2 A. I don't know. Like I say, you'd have to verify
3 that with Mr. Perrin. But those e-mails were only after he
4 established phone communication.

5 Q. Do you know who called who? Was it Mr. --

6 A. Yes, Mr. --

7 Q. -- Perrin that had reached him at this number
8 stated on the letterhead?

9 A. Yes, Mr. Perrin initiated the phone call after
10 looking -- several attempts to try to find a current number
11 for Mr. Coulthurst.

12 Q. Because it goes down there, if you notice, "I
13 never received either letter about an information
14 request..." So that's what I was curious, of which
15 correspondence was sent to him.

16 A. I'm presuming. He's referring to the initial
17 May, 2000, letter and then the -- which wasn't returned --
18 or the September 20th, 2000, letter that was sent certified
19 that he didn't claim. I was presuming that's what he was
20 referring to.

21 Q. Okay, now it mentions something in here about his
22 working with the BLM. What's been your correspondence or
23 work or your people's work with the BLM concerning these
24 federal lands?

25 A. We've only recently talked to the engineer with

1 the BLM out of the Albuquerque office, and apparently Mr.
2 Coulthurst has been working with them on some long-term
3 development issues on that property that appear to be
4 waterflood issues.

5 Q. Now, is this property currently under waterflood?

6 A. No.

7 Q. And so there's no production and no injection
8 whatsoever going on out there on any of these wells?

9 A. That's correct. If there's production going on
10 on some wells, my understanding is that is not -- that
11 these wells have not been reporting any production or
12 injection.

13 Q. Okay, just by reviewing 7 through 18 it looks
14 like some of them aren't even capable of producing.

15 A. That's correct.

16 MR. BROOKS: Mr. Examiner, it is our intention to
17 offer the production records as they're shown in the OCD
18 system through another witness.

19 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, I'll still reserve
20 judgment on the -- I guess what can be interpreted -- I'm
21 still not sure that can even be interpreted that way for
22 their request for a 30-day delay stated in Exhibit Number
23 6.

24 So I have no other questions of Mr. Chavez. Are
25 there any other questions of Mr. Chavez at this time, Mr.

1 Brooks?

2 MR. BROOKS: No, your Honor.

3 EXAMINER STOGNER: Thank you, Mr. Chavez.

4 Mr. Brooks?

5 MR. BROOKS: Call Jane Prouty.

6 Let's see, what happened to the exhibit folder?

7 Okay, yeah, the exhibit folder is still up there, good.

8 Thank you.

9 May I proceed?

10 EXAMINER STOGNER: Please.

11 JANE E. PROUTY,

12 the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon
13 her oath, was examined and testified as follows:

14 DIRECT EXAMINATION

15 BY MR. BROOKS:

16 Q. Would you state your name for the record, please?

17 A. Jane Prouty.

18 Q. And where do you reside?

19 A. In Santa Fe.

20 Q. And how are you employed?

21 A. I work for the Oil Conservation Division, I'm the
22 manager of the computing area for well production and
23 permitting.

24 Q. And are you responsible -- are you the individual
25 who is responsible for receiving, entering into the system

1 and maintaining the reports of production and injection
2 that are submitted by operators of wells in New Mexico?

3 A. The staff that I work with is, yes.

4 Q. And they act under your direction and
5 supervision?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. I will call your attention to what has been
8 marked as OCD Exhibit Number 1 and ask you to identify it.

9 A. Yes, this is a report of the wells on Exhibit A
10 and B that -- the production that we've received for those
11 wells. Just if you would look at the first page, for
12 example, for Chaparral Energy, they reported volumes
13 through August of 1998, and then those months that appear
14 after that, they submitted C-115s with this well on the
15 C-115s with this well on the C-115 but with no values for
16 gas-oil, water or injection. So that's pretty much how you
17 read the report.

18 Some other entries on here, I don't have a page
19 number specifically. If no C-115 -- If the particular well
20 was not on a C-115 it will say "No C-115 filed".

21 Q. Now, in making up this report -- Well, first of
22 all, you said that this report included the wells
23 identified on Exhibit A and Exhibit B. Now, by that are
24 you referring to Exhibit A and Exhibit B to the Application
25 that was filed in this case?

1 A. I believe so.

2 Q. Okay, thank you. And you have the ability to
3 make the computer generate the data in various formats,
4 correct?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And you could have instructed the computer
7 wherever the volume injected or produced was zero to print
8 out a zero no the report?

9 A. Right.

10 Q. But after discussing the matter with me, you
11 concluded to just have the computer show the month with a
12 blank if the report was filed but it reported zero
13 production?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Okay. So whenever, with regard to a particular
16 well, a month is listed and there are no other numbers
17 beside it under the columns "Gas", "Oil", "Water" and
18 "Inj", if there are no figures in any of those columns,
19 that means that the operator filed a report which included
20 that well but reported zero production of gas, oil and
21 water and zero injection as to that well?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And if the report shows -- if the computer did
24 not print out a particular month, that means, as I
25 understand your testimony, that the operator either filed

1 no C-115 for that month or did not include that well on
2 their C-115?

3 A. That's correct.

4 Q. Okay. Now, I will ask you to page over to the
5 4th page -- well, they are numbered, they're numbered in
6 the upper right-hand corner. Pages 4 through --

7 A. -- 17?

8 Q. Okay, I was seeing how far it went. Yes, pages 4
9 through 17. Now, do those refer to the wells that are
10 operated according to OCD records by Coulthurst Management
11 and Investment, Inc.?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And just looking through pages 4 through 17, I
14 don't see any volumes of production or injection reported?

15 A. Right.

16 Q. Okay. I think the exhibit will otherwise speak
17 for itself.

18 Now, there is one other thing I need to take up
19 with you, and I think that's all we need to say about the
20 exhibit at the moment.

21 You are familiar, are you not, with the inactive
22 well project which is being undertaken by the New Mexico
23 Oil Conservation Division?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. Okay. Now, since your involvement in it kind of

1 precedes Mr. Chavez's involvement, it might have been
2 better to put you on first as a witness. But we've got you
3 here now, so let me ask you to explain to us -- Well, first
4 of all, were you the person -- was it you or people acting
5 under your direction who generated the address list for
6 what has been referred to as the May 11th, 2000, letter?

7 A. Yes, we used the addresses in our computer
8 system.

9 Q. And you submitted an inquiry to the computer to
10 determine which operators should receive that letter,
11 correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. And what were the criteria on which you selected
14 the operators that should receive the May 11th, 2000,
15 letter?

16 A. The criteria was, it included operators who had
17 not produced for -- I can't tell you specifically the May
18 one -- for beyond the period of time of the Rule 201, let
19 me say that. I cannot tell you exactly which month at the
20 time, and of course production could have come in
21 subsequently, people who did not have production at that
22 time may not still be on that list.

23 But the criteria was that they have completions,
24 that the completion not be in the valid TA period or that
25 we have not received an extension.

1 Q. Now hold on a minute. When you say TA, that
2 means an approved temporary abandonment status --

3 A. Right.

4 Q. -- approved by the Division, correct?

5 A. Right.

6 Q. Go ahead.

7 A. Yes. And that we not have received production or
8 injection.

9 Now, I generated a large list of wells, and for
10 that particular mailing I wasn't in charge of exactly what
11 went out the door. My understanding is, only wells that
12 were classified as oil and gas were mailed. So I had
13 generated a larger list, including injection wells, but on
14 that particular May 11th mailing, just oil and gas wells
15 were mailed.

16 Q. Okay. Now, was a list generated by the computer
17 for each operator to be included with the May 11th, 2000,
18 letter?

19 A. Yes, Ben Stone developed the letter, and it had
20 every well listed, and it had a questionnaire on there
21 saying things such as, do we have the well classification
22 wrong, is this truly your well, do you feel it is producing
23 or injecting, can you send a C-115? So it had places for
24 the operator to fill it out and return it to us.

25 Q. Now, there were a much larger number of operators

1 on that mailing list than what's included here, correct?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And was that letter sent out by the Santa Fe
4 office of the OCD?

5 A. Yes, it was.

6 Q. Very good. Do you have a means of determining
7 that Coulthurst, in fact, received that letter -- or, in
8 fact, that that letter was sent to them, not that they
9 received it, because it wasn't sent certified?

10 A. Not in proof, no, but I keep track of any
11 envelopes ever returned to Oil Conservation Division for a
12 bad address, and we flag those until we get a good address,
13 and then we unflag them. And the Coulthurst address was
14 never returned as not an accurate address. So I have every
15 reason to believe the letter was mailed, because the
16 letters where we knew we didn't have valid addresses were
17 not mailed.

18 And also the follow-up letter -- also the first
19 letter, we knew, had not been returned, so I know that the
20 follow-up letter in September was also sent.

21 Q. Okay. Well, the follow-up letter has been
22 admitted in evidence --

23 A. Okay.

24 Q. -- on the testimony of Mr. Chavez, so we've gone
25 into that.

1 But when I prepared this Application, if you will
2 recall, you submitted to me a printout of wells that had --
3 in which you had entered Y's as to certain operators and
4 wells, and I believe you told me at the time that that
5 indicated that those operators and wells were included in
6 the May, 2000, mailing. Can you tell me on what basis you
7 gave me that indication?

8 A. I kept the file that generated -- the data file
9 that generated those letters.

10 Q. And this would be a file that you kept in the
11 ordinary course of your business as manager of the records
12 for the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division?

13 A. Yes.

14 MR. BROOKS: Okay, very good. I will request
15 admission of OCD Exhibit Number 1.

16 EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibit Number 1 will be
17 admitted into evidence.

18 MR. BROOKS: Pass the witness.

19 EXAMINATION

20 BY EXAMINER STOGNER:

21 Q. Ms. Prouty, maybe -- you may not be the person to
22 ask this question, but if so Mr. Chavez can step up. Do
23 you know when Coulthurst Management -- Did they drill the
24 wells, or how long have they been operator of the wells?

25 A. No, I don't know that.

1 EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Chavez, do you?

2 MR. CHAVEZ: Yes, those wells were drilled many,
3 many years ago. It's in a small oil field just in the
4 Torreon area in Sandoval County, and Mr. Coulthurst is one
5 of the latest operators. There have been many operators
6 before.

7 EXAMINER STOGNER: Do you know about when
8 Coulthurst took over operations?

9 MR. CHAVEZ: Early 1990s, late 1980s.

10 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, so -- and that's what I
11 was leading up to my question when I was looking at this
12 exhibit. I believe the earliest date shown for zero
13 production on all these, by the way, is 1997.

14 So Coulthurst, as far as Mr. Prouty and Mr.
15 Chavez -- as you both know, Coulthurst was the reflected
16 operator at that time; is that correct?

17 MR. CHAVEZ: Yes.

18 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. I have no other
19 questions of Ms. Prouty.

20 Mr. Brooks?

21 MR. BROOKS: Nor have I.

22 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, with the --

23 MR. BROOKS: I would like to put in Exhibit 2, if
24 I may.

25 EXAMINER STOGNER: Please.

1 MR. BROOKS: Your Honor, Exhibit Number 2 is my
2 affidavit of notice. Because we were continuing as to all
3 operators except Coulthurst I did not deal with the
4 operators other than Coulthurst in this affidavit, other
5 than to state that the notice was sent to everyone on the
6 mailing list attached to Attachment A to Exhibit 2.

7 But Attachment B to Exhibit 2, you will note, is
8 the certified mail receipt issued by the United States
9 Postal Service, showing that the letter was mailed to
10 Coulthurst Management and Investment, Inc., at 1990 Marin
11 Avenue, Berkeley, California 94707, which I will again
12 call your attention to, is the address shown on the
13 letterheads of the two faxes received October 16, 2001,
14 from Coulthurst.

15 The affidavit also states, which I believe to be
16 the fact as of this date, that the Division has neither
17 received a return receipt from the United States Postal
18 Service, nor has it received a return envelope containing
19 Attachment A to Exhibit Number 2.

20 Attachment C to Exhibit Number 2 is the notice
21 that was published in Sandoval County in accordance with
22 Division Rules.

23 Thank you very much, your Honor.

24 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, Exhibits 1 and 2 will be
25 admitted into evidence.

1 And while we're on this, just a couple -- just
2 one little thing that you can clarify for me. The
3 Application for 121 wells, the docket and the published
4 notice has 119. What are the other two wells? Are we
5 missing some, or are those --

6 MR. BROOKS: I believe -- and I had not reviewed
7 the notice to be sure it was correct. Originally it was
8 119. At the last minute in the preparation of the
9 Application, two wells operated by Noel --

10 THE WITNESS: -- Reynolds.

11 MR. BROOKS: -- Noel Reynolds were added to the
12 Application, and it may be my mistake that I may not have
13 gotten those added to the notice. I thought that I did,
14 but if I did not -- It doesn't matter, of course, as far as
15 the notice published in Sandoval County, because I believe
16 those are not in Sandoval County, but at the appropriate
17 time we can establish whether or not proper notice was
18 given as to the Noel Reynolds wells.

19 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, if you can check that
20 out, and whenever we hear this case again as it relates to
21 Noel Reynolds and the other operators, if you can address
22 that issue at that time.

23 MR. BROOKS: I will do so, your Honor.

24 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Now, back to Exhibit
25 Number 6, his request was to Mr. Charlie Perrin, which was

1 actually the wrong place to ask such a request. It's not
2 up to Mr. Perrin or the Aztec office to come down here and
3 ask for a continuance.

4 And also on Exhibit Number 5, if he was in
5 Berkeley, California, e-mailing this and he had 45 minutes
6 to catch a flight, I thought he would probably surely miss
7 it, and he has plenty of time to address these issues. You
8 don't catch a flight in 45 days --

9 MR. BROOKS: 45 minutes.

10 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- 45 minutes in these days,
11 this day and time.

12 So with that, if this is a request, it is denied.
13 I'm going to take this matter -- and I'm prepared to take
14 this matter under advisement if that's your intent at this
15 time, Mr. Brooks.

16 MR. BROOKS: That is my recommendation, your
17 Honor.

18 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Case Number 12,739, if
19 there's nothing further, will be taken under advisement as
20 it relates to --

21 MR. BROOKS: -- Coulthurst.

22 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- Coulthurst, and also I'd
23 like to include Julius -- How do you pronounce it?

24 MR. BROOKS: Chodorow.

25 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- Chodorow, Tasco and

1 Keystone Energy dismissals.

2 MR. BROOKS: Okay.

3 EXAMINER STOGNER: And could I have you provide
4 me a rough draft order, Mr. Brooks?

5 MR. BROOKS: I will do so.

6 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. And as far as the
7 remaining operators under Case 12,739, this matter
8 concerning those operators will be continued to the second
9 hearing in January. I don't have the dates, but it is
10 published upstairs and one can obtain it at that time.

11 If there's nothing further, we can proceed --


12 MR. BROOKS: Thank you.
