Phillips Petroleum Company (Phillips) supports the application of Burlington and Conoco to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for 80-acre infill development in the Basin Dakota pool. Phillips has reviewed the results of their pilot infill wells and agrees that the 80-acre infill wells are economically viable and necessary to recover additional gas reserves that would otherwise be left behind.

Phillips also supports the creation of well location rules for the Basin Dakota pool that are identical to the rules for the Blanco Mesaverde pool. This will facilitate recovery of additional gas reserves using downhole commingling, thereby requiring fewer wellbores, and minimizing surface impacts associated with pipelines and well locations.

Phillips believes NMOCD approval of the said application for 80-acre infill development in the Basin Dakota will be in the best interests of all parties by allowing recovery of additional gas reserves while protecting the correlative rights of all owners and minimizing surface impacts of development.
