WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 10:51 a.m.: 2 3 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay, Case Number 12,773, 4 amended Application of KUKUI Operating Company for 5 compulsory pooling and a nonstandard gas spacing and 6 7 proration unit, Lea County, New Mexico. Call for appearances. 8 9 MR. CARR: May it please the Examiner, my name is 10 William F. Carr with the Santa Fe office of Holland and 11 Hart, L.L.P. We represent KUKUI Operating Company in this 12 matter. 13 I have no witness, I have a statement. 14 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay, as I recall this -- I'm 15 trying to recall the previous hearing in this case. 16 the nonstandard spacing unit, was that previously approved? 17 MR. CARR: No, sir. The case was presented to 18 you January the 10th, and it included a request for a 19 329.83-acre --20 EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay. 21 MR. CARR: -- nonstandard unit, and that was because of a variation of a public land survey. And they 22 were also seeking pooling authority to drill a well at a 23 standard location. 24 25 Following the hearing and prior to the entry of

an order, they went out to stake the well and discovered that the location was over a pipeline. That, plus it was in fairly close proximity to a road, caused them to move the well 400 feet to the east. It is still at a standard location on the acreage that they're seeking it be pooled. The new location is 1980 from the north line, 800 from the east line. Previously, their location was 1200 feet from the east line.

We contacted the Division, I talked with you. We have, following that conversation, filed an amended Application changing the well location. We have renotified all affected parties, and I have an affidavit marked Exhibit A in this reopened case, which confirms that notice of the amended application was provided to all affected parties, and we would request that the case today be taken under advisement based on the record made on January the 10th.

EXAMINER BROOKS: Anything further?

MR. CARR: No, other than the numbers, the footage location. The testimony would be identical today.

EXAMINER BROOKS: Okay, and the new footage location is 1980 from the north and 800 feet from the east?

MR. CARR: Yes, sir.

EXAMINER BROOKS: Very good, Case Number 12,773

25 | will be --

1 EXAMINER STOGNER: Before you do that, I may have 2 something further. EXAMINER BROOKS: Go ahead. 3 EXAMINER STOGNER: Now, it was advertised in the 4 manner of nonstandard gas proration unit, but in fact it's 5 one of those elongated sections? 6 7 MR. CARR: Correct, and it is sort of what would be -- I don't know how to describe it. It would be the 8 northwest quarter, if you started in the northwest, and the 9 10 quarter directly below it, but there were the variations on 11 that, and --12 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, that would be Lots 1 --13 MR. CARR: Yes, correct. 14 EXAMINER STOGNER: -- the lots, the actual 15 descriptions, don't start till that south half, south half? 16 MR. CARR: That's right. EXAMINER STOGNER: So that -- It's nonstandard 17 18 inasmuch as it's an irregular section? 19 MR. CARR: Correct. And that -- it's certain 20 lots, and it's really described in the Application, but 21 it's described really as --22 EXAMINER STOGNER: It's a lot, you can't describe it. 23 MR. CARR: -- the west half of the north third or 24 something like that. There is a description in there, I 25

can find it. 1 Mr. Stogner, how it was described is Lots 1, 2, 2 7, 8, 9, 10, 15 and 16, the east half of the north third 3 and the east third of the central third. And I have never 4 5 dealt with a description quite like that before. EXAMINER BROOKS: Well, I've heard descriptions 6 7 like it in Texas. I don't recall ever hearing a 8 description like it in New Mexico before. 9 Anyway, that's the best description we 10 It's shown on the plat. EXAMINER BROOKS: Well, I was assuming maybe 11 12 there was a plat introduced previously, but there's nothing in the file. Is this all the file we have? 13 Exhibit 1 is a plat. It shows --14 MR. CARR: 15 EXAMINER BROOKS: It's probably in my office, 16 actually. Or Florene may have it, I don't know. 17 MR. CARR: Exhibit 1 did show basically how it 18 was broken out. But again, the best description we could 19 come up with was that... 20 EXAMINER STOGNER: I just wanted to verify what that portion of the section was, and --21 22 I think the safest way to describe it MR. CARR: 23 is by the lot numbers, because every tract within the 329.83-acre unit does have a lot number. 24 25 EXAMINER STOGNER: And actually --

MR. CARR: And again, it starts up in the --1 2 Really, it's in the north half. And we've been through this before. 3 have these irregular sections, it seems to me you start 4 5 with the southeast corner and work out from there. And so 6 this one is awkward. EXAMINER STOGNER: Well, surveyors start from the 8 southeast corner and work upwards and outwards. MR. CARR: 9 Right. 10 EXAMINER STOGNER: That's the reason your corrections are to the north --11 12 MR. CARR: Right. EXAMINER STOGNER: -- and to the west of the 13 14 township, and that's the variation they go on. 15 Okay, so the lot numbers are the descriptions. 16 MR. CARR: Correct. 17 EXAMINER STOGNER: And what is a Kukui? 18 MR. CARR: Kukui is the largest -- It's a company that's the largest property owner in the State of Hawaii, 19 20 and in the Rand Energy Company bankruptcy proceedings 21 succeeded to the interest, somehow, of Rand Energy. A new 22 company in this area. 23 MR. KELLAHIN: What's a Kukui? Is it a bird? 24 MR. CARR: If you -- Sitting over my left 25 shoulder is the nearest thing to a Kukui I know.
