WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 2 9:05 a.m.: CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: Okay, it looks like 3 everybody's here, so we will go ahead and get started. 4 5 It's just after nine o'clock on February 27th, 2003, and this is the first meeting for the year of the Oil 6 Conservation Commission. 7 My name is Lori Wrotenbery. I'm Director of the 8 Oil Conservation Division. 9 10 To my right is Jami Bailey who represents the Land Commissioner, Patrick Lyons, on the Commission. 11 12 And I should note that we're honored to have 13 Commissioner Lyons with us today. And please, Commissioner, if you want to interject or ask questions or 14 15 comment at any time, feel free to do that. 16 COMMISSIONER LYONS: Thank you. 17 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: We're glad to have you 18 here. 19 Also to my far right is Florene Davidson, the 20 Commission secretary. 21 To my left is Robert Lee, director of the Petroleum Recovery Research Center at New Mexico Tech, and 22 23 Governor Richardson and Secretary Prukop's appointee to the Oil Conservation Commission. 24 25 Then we also have to Commissioner Lee's left

Steve Ross, the Commission's counsel, and Steve Brenner who will be recording these proceedings for us here today.

We have, I think, a fairly short agenda today.

Should be done in an hour or maybe an hour and a half. I'm not sure at this point, it depends on how some of the evidentiary cases go here.

But I just wanted to welcome everybody. This is the first meeting of the Commission this year. We've got a new Governor, new administration, new Land Commissioner, so it's an exciting time. It's kind of surprising, I look at this table, though, and everybody's the same. We've got the same group, but working with some new bosses, and very pleased to be here in this environment.

We do have some organizational matters to take care of at the outset, since it is the first meeting of the year. And Steve, I think you were going to lay out for us some of the issues that we need to address today. If you'd like to go ahead with that.

MR. ROSS: Good morning, everybody, and congratulations again on your reappointments.

We have two housekeeping matters to deal with this morning, as we do -- well, one of the two we have to do every year, which is enact an open meetings resolution. And the second of which, we have an item on the agenda to elect a Chair of the Commission.

The Oil and Gas Act provides for the election of a Chair of the Commission, but it doesn't say when that election should occur. I spoke with its present Chair yesterday, and we came to the conclusion that since everyone had just been reappointed that perhaps it was the time to go through that process and elect a chair.

You have in your books the annual open meetings resolution. There was something left out of it. My fault, I did it rather hurriedly last week in the middle of a bunch of legislative stuff, and I did leave out one provision which is in the copy that Ms. Davidson has for you to sign. There was a sentence left out. It just says where a written request has been received, notice of these meetings is also to be provided to broadcast stations and newspapers. We don't normally do that, we have never had a request for notice, but the Statute requires us to have something like that in our resolution. So I've included that in the document you have in your books.

The resolution is the same as last year, with the exception of the dates of the meetings which, of course, are different.

So with that, unless you have some questions about the resolution -- I know we've been operating under it for several years -- we can go ahead and deal with both of these matters, election of a Chairman and adoption of

BRUCE: Yes, madame Chair --9 CHAIRMAN WROTENBERY: -- addressed in some other 10 11 way? 12 MR. BRUCE: -- and I'll let Mr. Carr make the 13 presentation. MR. CARR: May it please the Commission, Mr. 14 Arrington and Yates Petroleum Corporation have reached an 15 agreement verbally on how to resolve this matter. 16 17 Documents have not been signed. They were trying to beat today's hearing, but they didn't get there. 18 19 We would like to continue the case for one month. 20 We anticipate there will be no problem in getting this matter resolved between the parties, but we would like to 21 22 leave the case on the docket, with your permission, until 23 everything is signed. 24 And so we'd request a one-month continuance. 25 Okay.
