On June 17, 2002 I submitted a draft order to the Division. On August 2, 2002 I wrote you requesting that this order be given priority.

On September 11, 2002 I wrote you and enclosed Burlington's timeline describing the urgency of this order.

I heard nothing from anyone at the Division until September 12, 2002, when Mr. Ezeanyin advised me that the Division was "moving its draft of this case and we hope to get it in two or three week's time." Those 2-3 weeks have come and gone without the issuance of order.

Because this application will affect thousands of wells in the San Juan Basin, we believe the issuance of an order in this case should take priority over administrative applications involving single wells and other hearing applications now pending before the Division.

I receive several calls each week wanted to know why I am unable to obtain a order from the Division in such an important unopposed case. Those requests have increased substantially since the Division issued the Coal Well Infill Density Order (R-8768-C, October 15, 2002, which was a contested case heard on July 9, 2002).

Would you please write Mr. John Zent at Burlington Resources in Farmington and let me know this delay is neither my respectability or fault.

Pictured Cliffs 2002 Infill Pilot Program

BURLINGTON PLAN:

Drill 3 new PC infill pilot wells and recomplete 6 wells to the PC to evaluate the need for increasing the well density for the PC to 80-acre spacing.

STATUS:

The San Juan 27-5 Unit No. 152J and Huerfanito Unit No. 15J were drilled & cored in May and June of 2002 respectively. Each well remains uncompleted and shut-in awaiting receipt of Infill Pilot Order from NMOCD.

The third new drill pilot well, San Juan 32-9 Unit No. 98J, is schedule to spud the week of September 16th. The plan is to shut-in the well once casing is set and wait for receipt of the Infill Pilot Order.

The 6 wells scheduled for recompletion as PC infill pilot wells are:

- I. Angel Peak B No. 34
- II. Huerfanito Unit No. 77
- III. Huerfano Unit No. 227
- IV. Mangum No. 6
- V. Turner Hughes No. 16
- VI. Zachry No. 45

Three of these wells are ready to be recompleted, as they are 100% BR interest. However, the recompletion is being delayed until the Infill Pilot Order is received. This is due to the negative effects of fracturing a well and not allowing the well to clean up by flowing it.

PROBLEM:

Time is running out this year to finish all the work necessary to complete and test the 9 PC infill pilot wells. We do not want to perforate and fracture stimulate the pilot wells until we are able to flow them back for a sufficient amount of time. Experience has shown that PC wells may require weeks to months to clean up properly to avoid formation damage. In addition, if the work on these wells in not completed in 2002 we will lose our funding for these projects and have to apply for new budget monies in 2003. This could delay our ability to evaluate the potential of 80-acre PC wells.

ALTERNATIVE PROPOSAL IF ORDER IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN 30 DAYS:

To avoid the delaying the evaluation of the PC on 80 acres, we propose that we proceed with the completion/stimulation of the subject PC infill pilot wells and flow them as long as required to clean up. While the pilot wells are being flowed, we would shut-in the adjacent 80-acre (parent) well temporarily, until the NMOCD Infill Pilot Order is received, at which time both wells will be produced. This would also allow the opportunity to collect bottom hole pressure data on the shut-in parent wells (which was going to be done anyway).
