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WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 8:19 a.m.:

EXAMINER STOGNER: Call the hearing to order. Please note today's date, December 19th, 2002, Docket Number 40-02.

We will go over the continuances and dismissals on the record. I have a short announcement about today's proceedings.

On the first page, Case Number 12,977 -- this is the Application of McElvain Oil and Properties, Inc., for compulsory pooling, San Juan County, New Mexico -- this case will be continued to January 9th, 2003.

On the second page, Case Number 12,958 -- this is the Application of Arch Petroleum, Inc., for directional drilling, an unorthodox oil well location and a nonstandard oil spacing and proration unit, Lea County, New Mexico -- this case has been dismissed.

Case Number 12,962 -- this is the Application of David H. Arrington Oil and Gas, Inc., for compulsory pooling, Eddy County, New Mexico -- this case will be continued to January 9th of 2003.

Is there anything that needs to be said on the record, Mr. Scott Hall?

MR. HALL: No, sir. Thank you very much.

EXAMINER STOGNER: I left a message for you

yesterday evening about five o'clock -- I guess you had already left -- to tell you that that had been decided, so...

MR. HALL: Appreciate it.

EXAMINER STOGNER: The next one, Case Number 12,981 -- this is the Application of the Oil Conservation Division on its own motion to plug and abandon 16 certain wells in Roosevelt and Lea Counties, New Mexico -- this case will be continued to January 9th, 2003.

On page 3, Case Number 12,982 -- this is another Application of the Oil Conservation Division on its own motion to plug and abandon two certain wells in Eddy County, New Mexico -- this case will also be continued to January 9th, 2003.

Also there is a supplemental docket for today's cases involving two Ricks Exploration, Incorporated, cases. At the last hearing on December the 5th, these cases were continued on the record to today's docket. However, there was a written request to be dismissed. So at this time -- that's the reason they're appearing on today's docket -- Case Number 12,970 and 12,971, both Applications of Ricks Exploration, Inc., for compulsory poolings in Lea County, New Mexico, both of those cases are dismissed.

Are there any additional continuances or dismissals at this time?
