Further answering your letter of October 2, the case noted in the caption is set for hearing October 29, 2 P.M., Santa Fe. You should be prepared to present testimony in proof of the following fact:

That waste will not be caused by the 100 barrel allowable for the West Lusk Area mentioned in your petition. As to the fact that waste will not be caused by the 100 barrel allowable for the Barber Area, testimony on this point was presented at the hearing of Case 34 upon which Order No. 467 was based. It would seem that the testimony on that point in Case 34 could be incorporated into Case 38 by reference. That would preclude bringing up the same witnesses all the way to Santa Fe and obtaining the same written statements upon testimony already officially of record upon the same point in Case 34.

However, be sure to be prepared to present testimony along the lines indicated as to the West Lusk Area.
