Mr. Kelly: Please state your name and address.

- Mr. Al Greer: Al Greer Oil Well Drilling business Aztec, New Mexico
- Mr. Kelly: You were employed by this Commission years ago as oil and gas inspector?
- Mr. Greer: Quite a number of years.
- Mr. Kelly: You are quite familiar with the wells?
- Mr. Greer: Yes sir.
- Mr. Kelly: "specially familiar with the Williams wells?
- Mr. Greer: Yes sir.
- Hr. Kelly: When did you last visit the Williams wells?
- Mr. Greer: Yesterday.
- Hr. Kelly: What is the condition of the wells?
- Mr. Greer: One of them, section 19, there was joint of pipe $12\frac{1}{2}$, setting on the well no buildings, nothing there other than the pipe.
- Mr. Kelly: You would say that well had been abandoned for quite some time? Mr. Greer: Yes.
- Mr. Kelly: The other well?
- Mr. Greer: The other well was in the same condition, 6' of pipe sticking off the ground.
- Mr. Kelly: No work done for some time?
- Mr. Greer: For several years.
- Hr. Kelly: You are also the petitioner in this case what interest do you have in the land where the wells are located?
- Mr. Greer: A lease from the Santa Te Railroad Company, south $\frac{1}{2}$ of section 25, 40 acres in section 19.
- Mr. Kelly: Leaving the wells in the shape they are in right now, what will it do to your keases?
- Mr. Greer: I think if water comes in on the sand, it would damage my leases. Mr. Kelly: You believe the wells in the present condition are now, or will damage your leases?
- Mr. Greet: Yes, will or maybe have already done it.
- Governor Dempsey: Under existing condition, with the bond being in default,

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who is going to do that?

Mr. Greer: The bonding Company.

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Governor Dempsey: So far as I am concerned, this closes the hearing, allow for plugging of the wells, and it should have been done sometime ago. Mr. Kelly: Should have been, but has not been petitioned.

The hearing is adjourned - The Commission will issue an order directing the wellSto be plugged - the Insurance Company will have to make arrangements for the well to be plugged.
