

MR. SPURRIER: Someone has asked me to announce that the cases, 269 and 270, which are applications by Phillips for 80-acre spacing in the Denton area will be continued until the regular May hearing by agreement. They will be heard on May 22nd.

I think Mr. Morrell wanted to make an announcement.

(Announcement by Mr. Morrell.)

MR. SPURRIER: Is Amerada ready to proceed in Case 249?
MR. KELLOUGH: Yes.

MR. GRAHAM: The application of Amerada Petroleum Corporation for a temporary order establishing proration units and uniform spacing of wells for the Bagley-Siluro-Devonian pool, comprising SE/4 sec. 34, S/2 sec. 35, SW/4 sec. 36, T.ll S, R. 33 E; and W/2 sec. 1, all sec. 2, E/2 sec. 3, E/2 sec. 10, all sec. 11, W/2 sec. 12, T.l2 S, R.33 E continued to April 24.

MR. KELLOUGH: If the Commission please, Amerada is

ready to proceed in case 249. That is a spacing case.

At this time I would like to call attention to the Case 251 which is the next one set on the docket. That is the application for pooling. We would like to request a continuance of the pooling application until the July hearing.

I have discussed that with Mr. Morrell and also with Mr. Swarthout who represents Mr. Manders and I understand there is no objection to the continuance.

We hope that in the meantime we might be able to work out some arrangements where we can satisfy everybody on the pooling. That is Case 251.

Getting back to 249, we are ready to proceed on that.

MR. SPURRIER: Without objection then, Case 251 will be continued to the regular July hearing.

You may proceed in Case 249.
