Dear Mr. Spurrier:

We understand that the Knowles and Hightower spacing cases were continued to the regular January meeting of the Commission. We have not yet been advised as to the date of the hearing, and assume that it has not yet been set.

We have a spacing case set for hearing before the Industrial Commission of North Dakota on January 16. This is the first oil conservation case of any kind in North Dakota and it requires a great deal of preparation. We think it quite likely that the trial of the case in North Dakota may consume a week or more.

We therefore find it necessary to request a continuance of the Knowles and Hightower cases.

Mr. Millikan will be out of the State from February 13 to February 25 and Mr. Christie will be unavailable during the first week in March. Any other time during February or March will be satisfactory to us.

We do not believe that anyone will be prejudiced by a continuance of these cases. Since the North Dakota case has already been set we would like a postponement of the New Mexico cases until such time, at your convenience, the matter can be presented with all witnesses present. We want to be able to adequately and properly give your Commission all of the pertinent information which we have with reference to the Knowles and Hightower reservoirs so that these cases may be given the consideration they deserve.

We are asking Judge Seth to appear at the January hearing to request this continuance, and we would appreciate your favorable consideration.


