Comes now Continental Oil Company, hereinafter called "applicant", and respectfully requests approval of an unorthodox gas proration unit as described in the caption hereof and in support thereof would show the following:

1. Applicant is joint owner and is the operator of a lease known as the Sholes "B" lease which includes the E/2 W/2 and W/2 E/2 Section 19, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

2. Applicant drilled a well on said lease at a location described as the center of SE/4 SW/4 of said Section 19. Said well, known as the Sholes B-19 well No. 1, was completed in March, 1941, as a commercial gas well producing from the gas pool now designated by the Commission as the Jalco pool.

3. The W/2 of the SW/4 is part of a unit previously formed with the approval of the United States Geological Survey and under which the mineral ownership is diverse to that under the Sholes "B" lease. It would be impractical to form units of governmental quarter-sections in this instance in view of the disruption of equities already established.

4. Said well is the only well producing from the Jalco pool on the proposed unorthodox 160-acre gas proration unit.

Wherefore, applicant respectfully requests the Commission to place this matter on its docket for the regularly scheduled hearing for January, 1954, cause due notice to be issued thereof and upon hearing enter an order approving an unorthodox gas proration unit for applicant's Sholes B-19 well No. 1 as described above.
