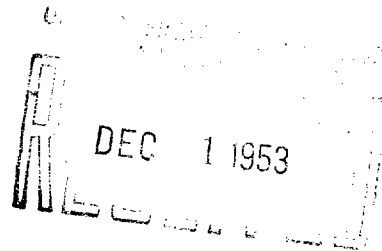
PACIFIC WESTERN'S State "D" #1 well was completed in December, 1936, in open hole below 5½" OD casing set at 3684' in the Grayburg formation. The well was drilled to a total depth of 3860' and potentialled 20 BOFD.

In May, 1951, the well was perforated between the intervals, 3410 - 3440', 3470 - 3490', 3520 - 3523', 3540 - 3570', all in the vertical limits of the Humont Gas Pool in the Queen formation. The oil and gas zones are segregated by a Baker production packer set at a depth of 3620' in the 5½" casing.



Gentlemen:

Comes now SKELLY OIL COMPANY, a Delaware corporation with offices in Tulsa, Oklahoma, operating for Pacific Western Oil Corporation, hereby petitioning the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission for approval of an unorthodox gas proration unit lying wholly in the Eumont Gas Pool, namely the E $\frac{1}{2}$ , NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 32, T20S, R37E., N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof does state:

1. That Pacific Western Oil Corporation is the sole owner of all leases on the 80 acres confined by the boundaries of the E $\frac{1}{2}$ , NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 32, T20S, R37E., N.M.P.M., and concerns but a single royalty owner, namely the State of New Mexico.
2. That Pacific Western Oil Corporation's well No. 1 is located 1980' from the North and 660' from the East boundaries of the lease and section and is completed within the vertical limits of the Eumont Gas Pool as defined by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.
3. That the above named lease is productive by virtue of its past production.
4. That a plat showing the above described lands and all offset properties indicating well locations and lease ownership to the best of our knowledge is hereto attached.
5. That all lands described above, and contained within the limits of the proposed proration unit, lie within a single legal subdivision (quarter section) of the U. S. Public Land Survey.

Wherefore, the petitioner requests that, in the interest of conservation and protection of correlative rights, the Commission grant an exception to Rule 7(a), Order No. R-370-A, by which the petitioner may operate the above described lands as a single unit.
