Dear Mr. Iden:

This is a belated reply to your inquiry of two weeks ago concerning the applicability of Commission Rule 404 (c) to the operations of the Continental Carbon Company and the Witco Chemical Company.

I discussed this matter at some length with Bill Macey earlier this week. Due to the fact that your request constitutes the first occasion we have had to construe and apply the rule as amended. I think you can appreciate our desire to carefully consider the matter and not to go off "half-cocked". We therefore would like for you to inform us as to just what changes, if any, your clients propose to make in their operations. For instance, is it proposed to increase the volume of natural gas to be used over that amount heretofore used in the manufacture of carbon black?

As soon as we learn just what changes are proposed to be made, we will advise you whether amended permits will be necessary after notice and hearing, under Rule 404 (c).
