RE: Case 748

The Commission, as you know, has directed that a dismissal order be issued in Case 748, which dealt with the "show cause" action directed to Paul Palmer and Associates relative to the plugging of the No. 1 Hutton Well, SW/4 SE/4 Section 17, Township 29 North, Range 13 West, San Juan County. The order is now being prepared for signature.

We note in your letter of July 1, 1954, to Paul Palmer that you were waiting for him to file Form C-103 showing results of plugging, and that you also asked that the landowner submit an affidavit showing acceptance of the water well which was completed after the lower sands were plugged off. Will you please let us know the current status of this situation? We would like to release the plugging bond covering the tract, but this cannot be done until the C-103 has been approved.

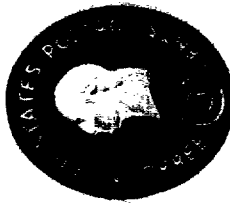
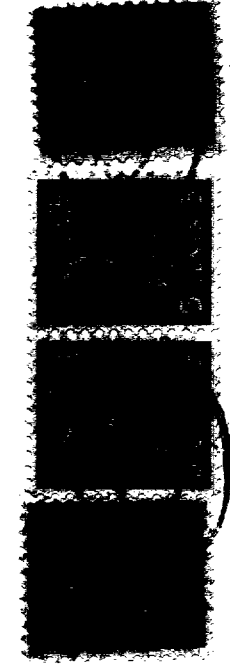

Dear Mr. Palmer:

I recently learned from your telephone message to our office that you had completed plugging operations and abandonment on your #1 Hutton well in the SE 1/4 17-29N-13W.

On June 29, 1954 I made an inspection trip to this well and from all outward appearances I see no reason why your plugging operation was not satisfactory. However, no form C-103 has been filed indicating that the cement plug was set below the water sand, at which point you were completing the well as a water well. I believe this depth was around 55 feet. Before this office will be able to approve the plugging, Form C-103 must be filed, showing exactly what work was done, and the present condition of the well. It will also be necessary to have Mr. Hutton sign an affidavit accepting responsibility for the water well. As this case has been advertised for open hearing for the regularly scheduled hearing on July 15, 1954, I would advise you to attempt to comply with the above as soon as possible and if this is done I believe I would be able to write a letter to the Oil Conservation Commission which would make it unnecessary for you to appear in Santa Fe on July 15.

Dear Mr. Palmer

I would like to briefly review the situation concerning the plugging of the above captioned well, and point out to you the necessity of immediately completing the plugging of this well.

In August, 1953, you were notified by R. R. Spurrier, Director of the Oil Conservation Commission in Santa Fe to immediately take steps to plug this well or the Oil Commission would take steps to call an open hearing for the purpose of having both you and the bonding company show cause why the well should not be plugged. A notice of intention to do this work had been filed with our office on December 22, 1952 by Mr. Sam J. Carson, who signed as your agent. The plugging program was approved by this office on December 22, 1952. Finally, late in August, 1953, Mr. Carson moved a crew to the rig and cement with which to do the plugging job. I made a personal inspection of the lease at that time and saw that preparations were being made to plug. This 25-sack plug was cemented in the Pictured Cliffs formation, extending into the production casing. However, this information has never been formally filed with this office. It was learned by personal inspection and conversation with Mr. Carson. Mr. Carson also stated that he wished to release the well to Mr. Hutton, the landowner, as a water well. This could be done, providing form C-103 was filed showing that the Pictured Cliffs sandstone was plugged and providing Mr. Hutton accepts responsibility for the well in writing. In the event that he will not accept responsibility, then a cement plug must be placed in the surface with heavy mud between plugs and a 4" marker left extending four feet above ground level.

Unless some action is taken within the next 7 days we will take steps to initiate a hearing before the Oil Conservation Commission in Santa Fe to have you and the bonding company show cause why the well should not have the plugging job finished.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to the above captioned well operated by you and located in San Juan County, New Mexico. The above captioned well is covered by a one well bond executed by the Western Casualty and Surety Company of Kansas.

According to information available to this Commission, the well was drilled to a total depth of 1,086'. According to a Form C-102, executed December 19, 1952, approval was granted by this office for you to plug the well. Our Astec representative, Mr. Emery C. Arnold, has advised us that as yet you have not done any of the work as proposed on your Form C-102.

Please take immediate action to plug the well properly and upon completion of the work file a Form C-103, outlining the work done in plugging the well and also a Form C-105, Well Log. In the event satisfactory steps are not undertaken immediately, it will be necessary for the Commission to hold an open hearing, citing both you and the Insurance Company to Show Cause why the well should not be properly plugged.

Your letter of the 10th at hand and Mr Carson who is the main owner advises me that work will proceed at once to properly plug the well.

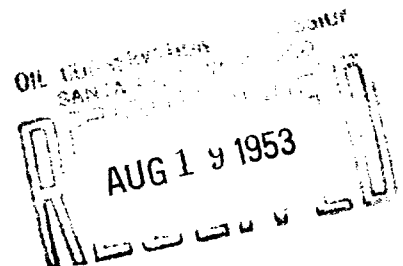
