Southeastern New Mexico nomenclature case, calling for pool creations and extensions in Lea County, New Mexico, as follows:

(a) Creation of the Hamon-Devonian Pool for production of oil from the Devonian formation, as described:

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 38 EAST, NMPM Sections 12 and 13

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 39 EAST NMPM Sections 7 and 18

(b) Extension of the North Echol-Devonian Pool to include:

TOWNSHIP 10 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM

SW/4 Section 22; NW/4 Section 27; NE/4 Section 28

(c) Extension of the Townsend-Wolfcamp Pool to include:

TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 35 EAST, NMPM All of Section 5

(d) Extension of the Dollarhide-Queen Pool to include:

TOWNSHIP 24 SOUTH, RANGE 38 EAST, NMPM N/2 Section 29

TRANSCRIPT OF HEARING

MR. SPURRIER: Case 750. Mr. Stanley?

S. J. STANLEY,

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

By MR. KITTS:

- Q Will you state your name and position, please?
- A S. J. Stanley, Engineer for the $N_{\mbox{\scriptsize e}}\mbox{\scriptsize w}$ Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.
 - Q You are based at Hobbs, New Mexico, are you not?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q Mr. Stanley, you have testified many times before this Commission as an engineer, have you not?
 - . A I have.
- Q Are you familiar with Case 750, calling for pool creations and extensions in Lea County?
 - A I am.

(Marked Commission's Exhibits 1 through 5, for identification.)

- Q I hand you what have been marked Commission's Exhibits 1 through 5, inclusive, and ask you to explain those exhibits, what they portray?
- A These exhibits are plats showing the creations of new pools and extensions of pools already defined by the Commission.
 - Q Were these exhibits prepared by you or under your direction?
 - A Yes, sir, they were.
 - Q What recommendations do you have to make in connection with

this case, Mr. Stanley?

A I recommend that the creations and extensions of existing pools be made as advertised, with one exception. In Case 750 (a), the Commission has advertised the creation of the Hamon-Devonian Pool, and I believe that it is not the policy of the Commission to name pools after living persons. I therefore recommend that the pool be renamed as the South Knowles-Devonian Pool.

Q K-N-O-W-L-E-S?

A K-N-O-W-L-E-S.

MR. SPURRIER: Is there objection to Mr. Stanley's recommendation?

MR. KITTS: That is all.

MR. PORTER: Would you give the name and location of the discovery well of that pool, in the recommendation, South KNowles Devoniar?

A The discoverer was Jack L. Hamon, Federal Davis No. 1, and a unit of Section 13, Township 17 South, Range 37 East, and the top of the perforations are 12,141 feet, as shown by the Commission records. I would also like to state, in reference to Mr. Porter's question, that on each and every one of these Exhibits we include the name and location of wells which will explain the reason for the extensions as advertised.

MR. SPURRIER: Is there a question of the witness? If not the witness may be excused.

(Witness excused.)

MR. SPURRIER: Do you have anything further?

MR. KITTS: No.

MR. SPURRIER: Does anyone have anything further? We will

take the case under advisement.
