Thank you for your letter of May 26 and the enclosures.

Since our conference in Santa Fe on May 19 a representative of The Ohio has contacted Southern Union and tentative arrangements have been made for sale of the gas to be produced from the well on the above identified lease. It is my understanding that a letter agreement is being prepared by Southern Union and it is our hope that the details of the sales contract can be worked out within the next several weeks. We expect to obtain approval of the other working interest owners in our Northwest Pearl Unit and will then be in a position to acquire the necessary right-of-way and make final plans for commencing production of the well.

We will keep your office posted on developments in connection with this matter.

Gentlemen:

With letter dated September 13, 1957, we submitted application of Sinclair Oil & Gas Company for approval of the North Pearl Unit embracing 2400 acres of land, more or less, located in Township 18-South, Range 35-East, N. M. P. M., Lea County, New Mexico, and requested that you set such application for hearing at the earliest possible date. Our Mr. A. H. Llwyd has advised me that the hearing is set on October 4, 1957.

I have this date been advised by our management here in Midland that a re-interpretation of the seismic information and a re-evaluation of the problems involved in creating the unit described in the original application makes it necessary to change the lands to be included in such unit so as to embrace additional lands not covered in the unit described in the original application.

I do not know at this time whether or not the publication of the notice has been commenced in the newspaper. If the same has not, we would like to substitute the application enclosed herewith covering 2,360 acres out of the same Township and Range, more particularly described in the enclosed application. I have attempted to reach you by phone this afternoon, but because of the strike involving telephone operators it has not been possible.

In the event you deem it necessary to amend the original application rather than substitute this application for the original application, I would appreciate your causing a new
