APPLICATION OF I & W HOT OIL SERVICE, INC., FOR AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE OPERATION OF SEVERAL OIL TREATING PLANTS FOR TANK BOTTOM EMULSION AND OTHER WASTE OILS IN EDDY AND LEA COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on October 24, 1957, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Daniel S. Nutter, Examiner duly appointed by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," in accordance with Rule 1214 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

NOW, on this $/3^{\frac{t}{2}}$ day of November, 1957, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the application, the evidence adduced and the recommendations of the Examiner, Daniel S. Nutter, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, I & W Hot Oil Service, Inc., proposes to construct and operate oil treating plants for the purpose of treating and reclaiming tank bottom emulsion and other waste oils at the following locations in Eddy and Lea Counties, New Mexico:

Adjacent to the Malco Pipeline approximately 12 miles Sast of Artesia, New Mexico,

Adjacent to the Texas-New Mexico Pipeline near Loco Hills, New Mexico, and

Adjacent to the Texas-New Mexico Pipeline near Maljamar, New Mexico.

- (3) That there is a need for the establishment and operation of said plants at the above-described locations.
- (4) That said plants will salvage oil which would otherwise be wasted.

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(5) That the subject application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicant, I & W Hot Oil Service, Inc., be and the same is hereby granted a permit to construct and operate oil treating plants for the purpose of treating and reclaiming tank bottom emulsion and other waste oils at the following locations in Eddy and Lea Counties, New Mexico:

Adjacent to the Malco Pipeline approximately 12 miles East of Artesia, New Mexico,

Adjacent to the Texas-New Mexico Pipeline near Loco Hills, New Mexico, and

Adjacent to the Texas-New Mexico Pipeline near Maljamar, New Mexico.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That, prior to commencing operation of said plants, the applicant shall file with the Commission a surety bond of performance, satisfactory to the Commission, payable in the amount of \$25,000.00 to the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico and conditioned upon the operation of said plants in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the term of this authority to operate the above-described oil treating plants shall be a period of one year from the effective date of this order, and that the applicant, I & W Hot Oil Service, Inc., may make application to the Commission for extension not less than 30 days prior to the date of expiration of said authority.
