Gentlemen:

Our client, Tamanaco Oil Corporation, has a C-101 on file with the Commission for its El Poso Ranch N-11 Well, which shows its proposed location to be in the center of Unit N of Section 11, Township 28 North, Range 1 East, in Rio Arriba County. Our client inadvertently drilled the well 175 feet from the South line and 1700 feet from the West line of the Section. The terrain over there is extremely rough, but it is my understanding that it would have been possible to drill on an authorized location. The only acreage that is being crowded however, is Section 14 to the South, the ownership of which is entirely common to that of Section 11. Please advise whether present Commission policies would permit administrative approval of the subject unorthodox location.
