We prefer that the resultant order from subject case does not show the plugging pattern for the affected wells. We would rather have the regular Forms C-102 for approval prior to the plugging operation so that we can witness the plugging.

The contractor who does the plugging should be able to move in and out prior to June 1, 1963.

If the order must show a plugging program, please use the following:
