Injection is to be through the 20 authorized injection wells, which shall all be equipped with plastic-coated tubing and packers set as near to the casing shoe or the uppermost perforation as is practicable.

As to allowable, our calculations indicate that when all of the authorized injection wells have been placed on active injection, and a well has been drilled in Unit P of Section 13, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, the maximum allowable which this project will be eligible to receive under the provisions of Rule 701-E-3 is 1806 barrels per day.

Please report any error in this calculated maximum allowable immediately, both to the Santa Pe office of the Commission and the appropriate district proration office.

In order that the allowable assigned to the project may be kept current, and in order that the operator may fully benefit from the allowable provisions of Rule 701, it behooves him to promptly
