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MR. NUTTER: We will call Case Number 5677.

MR. CARR: Case 5677, application of Yates Petroleum Corporation for a unit agreement, Chaves County, New Mexico.

MR. CARSON: Mr. Hearing Officer, I have just one witness in this case that was sworn in the previous case, Mr. Ray Beck.

MR. NUTTER: He is still under oath.

RAY BECK

called as a witness, having been previously sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CARSON:

- Q. For purposes of the record will you state your name again?
 - A. Ray Beck.
 - Q. And, Mr. Beck, what is your employment?
- A. Geologist for Yates Petroleum Company, Artesia, New Mexico.
- Q. And you have previously testified before this Commission, have you not?
 - A. Yes, I have.
 - Q. And your qualifications have been accepted?
 - A. They have.

MR. NUTTER: Proceed.

Q. (Mr. Carson continuing.) Mr. Beck, would you state the purpose of this application?

A. Yates Petroleum Corporation seeks approval of its Dunken, D-u-n-k-e-n, Nose Unit Area outlining six thousand, two hundred and thirty-two acres, more or less, of State and fee lands in Sections 1, 2, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15 of 17 South, 18 East and Sections 6 and 7 of 17 South, 19 East of Chaves County.

Q I hand you what has been marked as Applicant's
Exhibit One and ask if you would explain that exhibit to the
Hearing Officer?

A. Exhibit One is a land plat showing the proposed Dunken Nose Unit outline, the acreage situation around the proposed unit.

Q I hand you what has been marked as Applicant's Exhibit Number Two and ask if that was prepared by you or under your supervision?

- A. It was.
- Q. Would you explain that exhibit to the Hearing Office ?
- A. Exhibit Two is a surface structural map resulting from a photogeologic study of the region around the proposed unit. The mapped outcropping rocks are Permian-San Andres.

 The regional dip is to the east and east-southeast. Projecting into the western portion of the unit is a surface structural

nose coming off of the northern Dunken dome. Just to the east of the unit and just to the south of the unit are surface synclines. Surface faults in Section 3 of 17 South, 18 East may very well extend to a depth to intersect the easterly plunging nose at the western side of the unit.

We think that probably the structure increases in depth because the dip meter on the Yates Dunken Dome Well, for instance, indicated a steadily increasing structural dip formation of depth. Also a very porous permeable gas and water bearing Lower Pennsylvania sand was present in the Yates Dunken Dome Well. The primary objective then of the Dunken Nose Unit would be a Pennsylvanian sand reservoir crossing the deep and perhaps faulted nose.

MR. CARSON: I heretofore handed you a copy of the proposed unit and we have no further questions of this witness.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

- Q. What is the objective of this unit, Mr. Beck, does it call for the drilling of a well?
 - A. Yes, it does.
 - Q. What formation is that well to be drilled to?
- A. We will drill and complete it through the Pennsylvanian and bottom up in the Mississippian lime.

Q.	Do	you	have	any	idea	where	that	well	will	be
drilled?										

- A. We are thinking that it would probably be drilled in Section 10, in the northeast quarter, right now, from our preliminary look at the topography and the geology.
- Q. What is the status of the commitment of the acreage to the unit agreement?
- A. I understand that from the Yates' landman that he has contacted these people and they are all willing to cooperate in the unit on one basis or another.
- Q. What percentage of the land in the unit is operated by Yates?
 - MR. CARSON: Have you figured that out, Ray?
- A. Well, about sixty percent, I guess, fifty-five or something like that, just a guess.
 - MR. CARSON: It would be about sixty percent.
- Q. (Mr. Nutter continuing.) It would appear that C & K Petroleum is another owner of large interests in the unit area, what is the status of C & K Petroleum as far as the unit is concerned?
- A. Well, I understand that acreage once under lease to Tom Brown, as indicated on this land plat, has been taken over by C & K and our landman has been contacting them or attempting to work something out.
 - Q But they have not as yet committed their acreage to

the unit?

- A. Not in writing, as far as I know.
- Q. And how about the status as far as the State Land Commissioner is concerned, does he approve the unit?

MR. CARSON: I believe that he has, but I'm not sure.

MR. NUTTER: How about the USGS, have they approved the unit? I know that there is fee land, that's correct.

There is no Federal land.

MR. CARSON: No Federal lands.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of this witness? He may be excused.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)

MR. CARSON: May I offer those exhibits. I believe there are two in this case.

MR. NUTTER: Okay, Yates' Exhibits One and Two and the Unit Agreement will be accepted into evidence.

(THEREUPON, Yates' Exhibits One and Two and the Unit Agreement were admitted into evidence.)

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case 5677? We will take the case under advisement.
