MS. TESCHENDORF: Application of Union Oil Company of California for a unit agreement, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. STAMETS: Call for appearances in this case?

MR. CHRISTY: Sim B. Christy of the firm of Jennings Christy and Copple, Roswell, New Mexico, appearing for the applicant and we have two witnesses, Mr. Examiner.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any other appearances in this case? Please swear the witnesses.

(THEREUPON, the witnesses were sworn.)

## ROBERT LOCKHART

was called as a witness by the applicant, and having been first duly sworn, testified upon his oath as follows:

### DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CHRISTY:

- Q. Would you please state your name, address, and by whom you are employed and in what capacity?
- A. My name is Robert Lockhart and I am the District Land Manager for Union Oil Company of California, Midland District, Post Office 671, Midland, Texas, 79702.
- Q. Mr. Lockhart, are you familiar with what is sought by the application in Case 6028?
  - A. Yes, sir.

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A. We wish to farm a five thousand one hundred and
seventeen point four-three federal unit plan for the drilling
of a twelve thousand seven hundred foot Strawn test at a
legal location in the northwest quarter of the northeast
quarter of Section 13, Township 24 South, Range 35 East, Lea
County New Mexico.

Would you briefly tell the Examiner what is sought?

- Q. Is this a rather standard federal-fee type of an agreement?
  - A. Yes, it is.

Q.

- Q. How about participation for royalty and overriding royalty interest, is that based on acreage within a participating area?
  - A. Yes, sir.
  - Q. And a rather standard thing?
  - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Does the unit agreement provide for subsequent joinder and for contraction and expansion in typical fashion?
  - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. You mentioned the test well. Also what is unitized?
  Are all oil and gas for all formations unitized?
  - A. All depths, yes.
- Q. Now, tell me the percentage of federal and fee land involved?
  - A. We have approximately four thousand two hundred

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eight point five federal acres or a percentage of eightthree point six-four percent.

- Q. Eighty-three?
- A. Yes, sir, uh-huh. The fee acreage is eight hundred thirty-six point nine-three acres and approximately sixteen point three-five percent.
  - 0. No state land involved?
  - A. No, no state land involved.
- Q. Now, has the United States Geological Survey given preliminary approval?
  - 0. Is that indicated on Exhibit Two?
  - A. Yes, sir.
  - Q. It's a letter?
  - A. It's a letter dated July 29, 1977.
- Q. Have you received informal approval yet from any of the working interest owners?
- A. Yes, sir. Approximately ninety-five plus percent approval from our initial contact with the proposed working interest owners who are to join in the drilling of this well.
  - MR. CHRISTY: I have no further questions.
- MR. STAMETS: Any further questions of this witness?
  He may be excused.
  - MR. CHRISTY: Mr. Lockhart, before you are excused

you understand that if this is approved and the unit is activated you must supply the O.C.C. with one fully executed copy of the agreement and ratification, don't you?

A. Yes, sir.

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- Q. And you will do that?
- A. Yes, sir.

MR. CHRISTY: That's all.

(THEREUPON, the witnes was excused.)

## CHARLES CAREY

was called as a witness by the applicant, and having been first duly sworn, testified upon his oath as follows:

### DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CHRISTY:

- Q Would you please state your name?
- A. Yes, my name is Charles Carey.
- Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A. The Union Oil Company of California and I am the New Mexico District Exploration Manager.
- Q. What is your educational background in the oil industry, sir?
- A. I received my Bachelor's Degree from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, in 1948 --
  - Q. What degree was that in?

A.	Tn	Geology.

Q. All right, sir. Then, I attended one year of graduate study at Pennsylvania State University also in geology and I also attended Stanford and Cambridge Universities in England.

My entire professional career, twenty-eight years, has been with the Union Oil Company of California, fifteen years in Bakersfield as a palaeoantologist particularly for geologists, three years in the Los Angeles Basin directing on-and-off-shore geological exploratory efforts, seven years in Roswell, New Mexico, as District Exploration Manager and three years in Midland, Texas, as the New Mexico exploration manager which is current.

Q. Mr. Carey, the lands involved in this application are located in Township 24 South, Ranges 35 and 36 East, Lea County. Are you familiar with this geological area?

A. Yes, I am.

MR. CHRISTY: Are the witness' qualifications satisfactory?

MR. STAMETS: They are.

Q. (Mr. Christy continuing.) Now, Mr. Carey, tell us from a geological standpoint what is sought by the application of 6028 and what are your recommendations?

You may refer to Exhibit Three, if you will.

A. The recommended Luzon Unit Area is in southern

Lea County, New Mexico, about eight miles northwest of the town of Jal. It is located at the western edge of the Central Basin Platform. Union Oil Company of California proposes to drill a fourteen thousand eight hundred foot test located in the northeast quarter of Section 13, Township 24 South, Range 35 East.

The Luzon Prospect is expected to produce gas and condensate from Strawn carbonates and possibly, Morrow sands. The expected productive limit of the Strawn reservoir is shown in red on the map contoured on top of the Strawn. It is a geophysical map with detailed geophysical control. You can see the unit is to include the sections as indicated in red on the map.

The idea behind the prospect is one in which the Strawn thickens anomalously over the prospect area. It averages about three hundred feet thick surrounding the prospect and based on geophysical control it thickens to over one thousand feet in the prospect area. It is thought to be a detrital apron composed of porous carbonate rocks derived from a Strawn reef that was subsequently deposited in the vicinity covering the prospect area.

The Middle Morrow sands also may produce. They are a secondary objective and we believe there is good potential of Morrow sands being present in the prospect area.

A. The other one is a cross section, an east-west cross section which is indicated in red, Section B-B prime, indicated on the structural contour map and it shows the Strawn carbonate deposit indicated in the cross hatch and in red that we believe will be productive.

It also shows the middle Morrow which is the secondary objective.

Q. Do you believe from a geological viewpoint that the granting of the unit agreement may result in the conservation of energy and the prevention of waste underlying the unit area?

- A. Yes, I do.
- Q. Were Exhibit Three and the maps attached prepared by you or under your direct supervision?
  - A. They were.

MR. CHRISTY: That's all of the questions I have.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any question of the witness?
He may be excused.

MR. CHRISTY: I offer Applicant's Exhibits One through Three inclusive.

MR. STAMETS: These exhibits will be admitted.

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MR. CHRISTY: That's all we have.

MR. STAMETS: Is there anything further in this

case? The case will be taken under advisement.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)
