MR. NUTTER: We will call next Case Number 6113.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 6113, application of Transocean Oil, Inc., for a unit agreement, Catron County,
New Mexico.

MR. CARR: If it please the Examiner, I'm William F. Carr, Catron, Catron and Sawtell, Santa Fe, appearing on behalf of the applicant and I have one witness to be sworn.

(THEREUPON, the witness was duly sworn.)

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, on January 19, 1977 this
Commission heard the application of Transocean for approval
of its Omega Unit in Catron County. That unit terminated on
January 1. The application today involves virtually the same
area; the Cibola Unit overlies a portion of the Omega Unit.
The geological testimony entered in that prior case is identical to what we would offer today and for that purpose we would
request that the record in Case 5838 be incorporated into the
record of this hearing.

MR. NUTTER: I presume it is the intent to unitize the same geological structure or feature that was unitized in the original Omega Unit, is that it?

MR. STANLEY: Not exactly, no, sir, there is a portion of the land overlying each other.

MR. CARR: The prior case, Mr. Examiner, included or was an application for approval of three unit areas. The geological testimony, however, in that case would be identical

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to what would be presented today.

MR. NUTTER: I see. Now you want to incorporate the record of Case Number 5838 in this record?

MR. CARR: Yes, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Case Number 5838 record will be incorporated in the record of Case Number 6113.

Would you proceed?

JOE STANLEY

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CARR:

- Q Will you state your name and place of residence, please?
- A Joe Stanley, 3411 Village Oaks Drive, Kingwood, Texas.
 - Q Mr. Stanley, by whom are you employed?
- A I am an independent petroleum land consultant. In this hearing I represent Transocean Oil of Houston.
- Q Mr. Stanley, have you previously testified and had your credentials accepted and made a matter of record by this Commission?
 - A Yes, I have.
 - Q Are you familiar with the application in this case?

A Yes, I am.

- MR. CARR: Are Mr. Stanley's credentials acceptable?
 MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.
- Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) What is Transocean seeking to accomplish with its application in this case?
 - A To form an exploratory unit.
- Q Mr. Stanley, have you prepared or has there been prepared under your direction and supervision certain exhibits for introduction in this case?
 - A Yes.
- Q Would you please refer to what has been marked for identification as Exhibit Number One and identify it for the Examiner?
- A This is a form of a Federal unit which is normally used covering Federal and State lands for an exploratory unit such as this.
- Q Does this unit agreement provide for submission of plans for unit development to the Oil Conservation Commission?
 - A No, it does not.
- Q Would you have any objection to the Commission's order requiring that these plans be so submitted?
- A No.
- Q Would you please refer to what has been marked as Exhibit One-A and explain what it is and what it shows?
 - A Exhibit One-A is attached to the unit agreement

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previously referred to and is a map showing the unit area outlined in the various types of acreage, mainly being Federal lands, State lands, and Patented lands.

- Q Would you refer to what has been marked as Exhibit One-B and explain what it is and what it shows?
- Exhibit One-B is also an attachment to the Unit Α Agreement, which is a tabulation of the leases showing a description of each of the leases, the number of acres, the serial number, the lessee of record, overriding royalty owners and working interest and percentages.
- 0 Has the Cibola Unit been designated by the USGS as a logical unit area?
 - Α Yes, it has.
- Q And is there a letter of approval marked for introduction as Exhibit Number Two?
 - Yes, it is. Α
- Has the form of this agreement been approved by the 0 State Land Office?
- Yes, it has. Α
 - Q And are the letter of approval marked as Exhibit Three in this case?
- Α Yes, they are.
- 23 Mr. Stanley, what is the present commitment of 24 acreage to the Cibola Unit?
 - Α The present commitment is all working interest

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owners are committed, all overriding royalty interest owners are committed and once Federal and State approval is received, approximately ninety-nine point four eight percent of the royalty interest owners will be committed.

- Q And this is sufficient commitment of acreage to afford control of the unit?
 - A Yes, it is.
- Q In this unit agreement is Transocean designated as the unit operator?
 - A Yes.
 - Q When do you hope to drill a test well on this unit?
 - A As early as two weeks.
 - Q And where will this test well be drilled?
- A It will be located in the northeast quarter of Section 33, Township 2 North, Range 14 West.
 - Q To what depth do you intend to drill?
- A A depth sufficient to penetrate the basement complex or sixty-five hundred feet, whichever is lesser.
 - Q What formations are you seeking to unitize?
 - A All depths.
- Q Mr. Stanley, in your opinion will approval of the proposed unit promote the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights?
 - A Yes.
 - Q Were Exhibits One, One-A, One-B, Two, and Three

prepared by you or under your supervision and direction?

A Yes, they were.

MR. CARR: At this time, Mr. Examiner, I would offer into evidence Transocean Exhibits One through Three.

MR. NUTTER: Exhibits One through Three will be admitted into evidence.

(THEREUPON, Transocean Exhibits One through Three were admitted into evidence.)

MR. CARR: I have nothing further at this time.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

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Q Mr. Stanley, you mentioned that all of the working interest had been committed to the unit but I note that the one fee lease in here owned by Frank Elliot is unleased. Has he committed his land as a working interest owner?

A No, he hasn't.

Q So all of the working interest that has been leased is committed?

A Yes.

Q Now I also note that there is an override on a great deal of this land held by CPGS, is this Colorado Plateau Geological Services?

A Yes.

Q So they have an override throughout the unit?

A Yes, they do.

Q And that location for the discovery well or the initial well would be in the northeast quarter of 33, 2 North, 14 West?

A Yes, sir.

Q And that would be drilled to the basement complex or to sixty-five hundred feet, is that correct?

A Yes.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of this witness? He may be excused.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, inasmuch as Transocean plans to spud the well within two weeks we would request that the order would be expedited.

MR. NUTTER: We will do what we can, Mr. Carr.

Does anyone else have anything to offer in Case Number 6113? We will take the case under advisement.
