OXY requests the Oil Conservation Division grant the following relief:

- (1) To rescind Division Order R-4808, effective May 1, 1988;
- (2) To place the Citgo Empire Abo Unit under the provisions of Division Order A-261, statewide oil proration order effective May 1, 1988;
- (3) That each well in the current unit that is capable of production be assigned an allowable pursuant to Order A-261 effective as of May 1, 1988;
- (4) That all underproduction accumulated on each well identified in item (3) above during each monthly proration period, beginning May 1, 1988 to the present, be reinstated effective the first month following the issuance of an order in this case;
- (5) That OXY be granted an exception from Rule 502 and be provided a period of time not to exceed two years to make up the underproduction referenced in item (4) above;
- (6) That any well that is overproduced after the reinstatement of said allowable be shut-in until the overproduction is made up; and
- (7) The Division approve the combining of the proration and spacing units within the Citgo Empire Abo Unit area pursuant to Rule 507 and OXY be afforded the flexibility to

produce the allowable attributable to the wells within the unitized area from any well or wells or combinations thereof.

In support of this application states:

- 1. OXY operated the Citgo Empire-Abo Pressure Maintenance Project pursuant to Division Order R-4808 dated June 11, 1974 in the Empire-Abo Pool until March, 1988 at which time it ceased the re-injection of gas in to the project area.
- 2. OXY determined that as of April 1, 1988, it was no longer economically feasible to continue the re-injection of gas into the project area.
- 3. Because of the economic situation which necessitated the ceasing of re-injection, OXY was forced to obtain a market for this gas, and this prevented OXY from producing its allowable for at lease twelve months even though its wells were capable of doing so. Therefore, OXY should be allowed to carry forward allowable that was canceled after May 1, 1988.
- 4. OXY has further determined that Division Order R-4808, dated June 11, 1974, is outdated, adversely affects the ability of OXY to compete with other operators in the pool, is no longer necessary.
- 5. In the interests of prevention of waste and protection of correlative rights, Order R-4808 should be

terminated using a procedure to provide an efficient transition from the pressure maintenance provisions and rules to rules applied to other operators in the Empire Abo Pool who are not subject to pressure maintenance procedures.

- 6. OXY seeks a procedure to replace the current pressure maintenance oil well production allowables with the same allowable limitations as the other operators of non-pressure maintenance projects are using in the Empire Abo Pool.
- 7. OXY seeks a procedure whereby allowables would be assigned on a unit basis to afford OXY the ability to produce the low GOR wells to maximize liquid recovery and thereby avoid the waste of hydrocarbons.

Our firm represents OXY USA, Inc. and has filed the referenced application which is now set for hearing on your docket for July 25, 1991.

On June 5, 1991, representatives of OXY and ARCO and their respective attorneys met with you and representatives of the Division concerning the docketing of previously submitted applications by both companies raising issues against each other concerning their respective Empire Abo projects.

The Division advised that it was unwilling to docket the ARCO show cause application against OXY and visaversa. As a result of the Division suggestions at that meeting, we amended our application to include additional issues concerning these projects. Mr. Michael E. Stogner July 19, 1991 Page 2

By letter dated July 12, 1991, but not received by me until July 16, 1991, Mr. Carr, on behalf of ARCO, again seeks to docket what amounts to another show cause application against OXY. Mr. Carr's letter contains certain erroneous contentions which he submits to you as statements of fact. In addition, the ARCO application is predicated upon unsupported allegations which OXY believes to substantially misrepresent the OXY operations.

At OXY's request, two meetings have been held with ARCO personnel since the June 5th Division meeting. At the first meeting, OXY presented calculations contesting ARCO's allegations of unit overproduction. Despite this, ARCO has refused on both occasions to even discuss the basis of their allegations, much less make any reasonable attempts to reach a mutually satisfactory solution.

ARCO continues to frustrate OXY's ability to try to resolve these questions, even though the Division has suggested that the parties settle the disputes. In addition, ARCO continues to request more and more data from OXY. I have just received another letter from Mr. Carr dated July 17th in which he has a two page list of additional data requests.

Accordingly, as a result of ARCO continued unwillingness to co-operate, OXY is unable to properly prepare for hearing on July 25, 1991. Therefore, OXY hereby moves the Division to continue the OXY case until August 23, 1991 and to dismiss with prejudice the ARCO application filed by letter of July 12, 1991.

Further, OXY requests that a pre-hearing conference be docketed on August 8, 1991 to have the Division establish the procedures for hearing of this matter including determining what data will be produced and when the data for all parties will be exchanged. 

TO DISMISS SHOW CAUSE APPLICATION

COMES NOW OXY U.S.A., INC. ("OXY"), by and through its attorneys, Kellahin, Kellahin & Aubrey, and moves the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division to dismiss the application of ARCO Oil & Gas Company ("ARCO") to cause OXY to appear and show cause why its Citgo Empire-Abo Unit Pressure Maintenance Project, authorized by Division Order R-4808 should not be shut in, and as grounds therefore states:

1. OXY operates the Citgo Empire-Abo Pressure Maintenance Project pursuant to Division Order R-4808 dated June 11, 1974 in the Empire-Abo Pool.

- 2. ARCO operates its Empire-Abo Unit Pressure Maintenance Project subject to the terms and conditions of Division Order R-4549, as amended.
- 3. OXY and ARCO projects share a common boundary in the Abo formation and are in communication with each other.
- 4. The issues of concern to ARCO about the OXY project have been discussed between OXY and ARCO at various times, including various dates in March and April, 1991.
- 5. On April 5, 1991, ARCO represented to OXY that ARCO desired to negotiate a resolution of this issue and suggested alternatives to a complete shut-in of the Citgo Empire-Abo Unit.
- 6. On April 5, 1991, prior to ARCO filing its Show Cause application, OXY submitted these issues to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, and a copy to ARCO, for an interpretation, copy attached as Exhibit "A."
- 7. On April 9, 1991, pursuant to the discussion on April 5, 1991, OXY proposed by letter to ARCO a method to resolve this dispute.

- 8. On April 23, 1991, without prior notice to OXY, ARCO, unilaterally changed its position and abruptly, without justification, filed for the Show Cause Hearing seeking for the first time a total shut-in of production from the OXY project.
- 9. A Show Cause hearing is premature at this time and should be dismissed.
- 10. There is no evidence to support the contention of ARCO that the OXY project is draining reserves from the ARCO project.
- 11. From a correlative rights standpoint, ARCO has not been damaged by any operations of OXY because OXY has underproduced its allowable on a cumulative basis since gas injection ceased in March, 1988.
- 12. Dismissal of the Show Cause application would still afford to ARCO an opportunity at a later date to request a hearing before the Division in event the resolution of this matter is not acceptable to ARCO.
- 13. ARCO's unwarranted allegations unnecessarily have required OXY to expend time, money and effort in this matter for which OXY should be compensated.

We have discovered an error in our voidage calculations that are shown on the Pressure Maintenance Project Operator's Report for the above referenced Unit. Consequently, OXY presents the corrected voidage calculations as shown on the attached summary sheet. The numbers have been recalculated back to March 1988, when we ceased injection. The mistake was made in the Bg (gas formation volume factor) that was used to convert produced volumes of gas and liquids to reservoir volumes. As you can see from the attached table, the inaccuracy was very small in 1988, but grew larger as the difference between the Bg our program was using and the correct Bg ballooned. Another correction we would like to make to the Project Operator's Report concerns the existence of the gas bank, which is described in Rule 9 of our pool rules. At the behest of ARCO, our offset operator, we reviewed the status of the gas bank in light of the cessation of injection operations on our Unit. We now conclude that the existence of a gas bank against which credit may be drawn to allow overproduction of the daily allowable may not be appropriate at this time.

This puts us in a gray area concerning future operations. If one assumes that allowable that was not used during one month may be carried forward to succeeding months, then we are currently underproduced by almost 250,000 reservoir barrels since March 1988. Our pool rules are completely silent on this aspect of proration; obviously "blowdown" was not contemplated in the drafting of these rules. On the other hand, if no allowable can be carried forward from month to month, we have accumulated enough overproduction that it would take almost a full year's shutdown to make it up. We do not believe that this is a fair interpretation, since unused allowable was carried forward as long as there was injection (i.e. the gas bank). Also, Rule 5 of ARCO's pool rules for their Empire-Abo Unit allow for the carryforward of overproduction, albeit in limited amounts. From a correlative rights standpoint, we do not believe that we have damaged ARCO because we have underproduced our allowable on a cumulative basis since we ceased injection.

In order to resolve this matter and provide some guidance for the

future operation of our Unit, OXY respectfully requests that the OCD accept our interpretation that carryforward of unused allowable is permissible under our pool rules. If the OCD declines to accept this interpretation, then we request that a hearing be docketed on OXY's application to:

* carryforward and/or re-instate allowable that was canceled after March 1, 1988;

* amend the pool rules to allow underage and overage to be carried forward in the same manner allowed in Order No. R-8170 for prorated gas pools in Southeast New Mexico;

* make any other amendments to our pool rules as may be necessary for future operations to protect correlative rights and prevent waste.

OXY will produce no more than our maximum daily project allowable of 2213 reservoir barrels until this matter is resolved. By copy of this letter we are notifying our offset operator, ARCO, of our intentions.

We are also sending a copy of this letter and attachments to the OCD office in Artesia to correct the past reports. If the OCD would like to have additional information to correct the record, please advise.

OXY sincerely regrets the inconvenience caused by our mistake. I assure you it was unintentional, and we stand ready to take whatever action the OCD deems appropriate to resolve this problem.
