NEARBURG PRODUCING COMPANY, through its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for approval of an unorthodox well location, and in support of its application states:

- 1. Applicant is the operator of the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 32, Township 24 South, Range 29 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico, and proposes to drill its Emerald 32 Federal No. 1 Well at an unorthodox location 2007 feet from the North line and 1470 feet from the West line of said Section 32.
- 2. Applicant seeks an exception to the well location requirements of Division Rule 104 to permit the drilling of the well at the above-described unorthodox location to a depth to adequately test the Delaware formation.
- 3. Approval of this application will afford applicant the opportunity to produce its just share of hydrocarbons underlying this spacing unit and will otherwise be in the best interest of conservation, the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights.
