STATEMENT OF CASE

APPLICANT

On May 6, 1992, the Division issued Order R-9673 which pooled Conoco's interest in the NE/4 of Section 17 for the drilling of a well specifically ordered to be drilled in the SW/4NE/4 of Section 17.

On July 17, 1992, in violation of Order R-9673 and without notice to Conoco, Inc, Southwest Royalties commenced the well in the wrong quarter-quarter section, the NW/4NE/4 of Section 17.

On August 17, 1992, the Division Director issued its decision advising Southwest Royalties that Order R-9673 was void.

On August 13, 1992, Conoco, Inc. proposed to Southwest Royalties that Conoco be designated as operator of the well, that Conoco participate in the well and pay its share of reasonable actual costs of the well.

Southwest Royalties has refused to enter into voluntarily discussions with Conoco concerning the well located in the NW/4NE/4 of Section 17.

Southwest Royalties filed its application in Case 10471 (reopened) prior to making any effort to reach a voluntarily agreement with Conoco concerning the well now located in the NW/4NE/4 of Section 17.

Conoco has been unable to reach voluntary agreement and now seeks a compulsory pooling order.
