Phillips Petroleum Company respectfully requests administrative approval of an unorthodox location for the Ranger Well No. 17 in the West Ranger Lake (Devonian) pool. This well is located 660' FWL and 860' FSL of Section 26, T-12-S, R-34-E, Lea County, New Mexico. In order to allow time to secure a lease of the surrounding properties, the first application to drill, dated October 11, 1991, was to a total depth of 13800' in the Devonian formation as an oil producer. After surrounding properties were leased, the application was amended December 19, 1991 to a total depth of 16500' in the Ellenburger oil zone. The Ellenburger formation was the original zone of interest as reflected by the attached casing design.

The Ellenburger zone was not productive and approval was granted by the OCD district office to test the Devonian formation which has proved commercial.

As stated in Statewide Rule 104-F(1), exception to well location requirements may be granted without notice and hearing when the necessity for the unorthodox location is to recomplete a well previously drilled to a deeper horizon.

Please find attached a plat showing the ownership of all leases offsetting the proration unit and all wells completed thereon. All operators of proration or spacing units of setting the proration unit for the Ranger Well No. 17 have been notified of this application by certified mail.
