APPLICATION

Santa Fe Energy Operating Partners, L.P. hereby makes application for an unorthodox well location and a non-standard spacing and proration unit in the S^1_{2} of Section 4, Township 22 South, Range 24 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states:

- 1. Applicant is an interest owner and has the right to drill a well in the S^{1}_{2} of said Section 4.
- 2. Applicant proposes to drill its Jones Canyon 4 Fed.
 No. 1 Well at an unorthodox location 660 feet from the South line
 and 1950 feet from the West line of the Section, to a depth
 sufficient to test the Cisco/Canyon formation.
- 3. The proposed well is within the boundaries of the Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Gas Pool, which is spaced on 640 acres pursuant to Order No. R-2240. Applicant will complete the well in the interval producing in the adjoining Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Associated Pool, which is spaced on 320 acres. Based on recent well completions in the immediate area, Applicant anticipates the well will be completed as an oil well. As a result, Applicant seeks to dedicate the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 4 to the well, and form a 320 acre non-standard spacing and proration unit, as permitted by Rule 3 of Order No. R-2440.

- 4. The unorthodox location is necessitated by both topographic/environmental and geologic reasons.
- 5. Concurrently with the filing of this application, Applicant has filed an application to contract the boundaries of the Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Gas Pool by deleting therefrom all of Section 4, Township 22 South, Range 24 East, N.M.P.M., and simultaneously expand the boundaries of the Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Associated Pool to include said acreage. Under the special pool rules for the Indian Basin-Upper Pennsylvanian Associated Pool, the above location and unit are standard. This application is made in the event the contraction/extension application is denied.
- 6. The approval of the unorthodox well location and non-standard unit will prevent the drilling of unnecessary wells, prevent waste, and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that the Division grant the relief requested above.
