Worth, Texas, in our before they committed, and this is a succession of letters back and forth, phone conversations, and then after we talked to them they said they would -- they would look at the information but we could not let them look at it without some type of commitment to either join or farm out, so we talked to them about that and they said if they did -- they would either join or farm out but they gave us some real tough farm out terms, 50 percent back in, and so forth, so finally decided we'd try to work with them, and so they looked at our information and then decided that they would not join, that they would farm out but only if we made a 1280-acre unit, which we didn't want to do, and we had never asked for a farmout on more than just that north half of the northwest of Section 13.

so we finally did tell them that we could not, none of our partners could live with the terms of 1/16th override and a 50 percent back in, that we would do it on a 25 percent backin basis.

They declined to do this and the partner-ship agreed unanimously that we would just leave that 80-acre tract out of our working interest unit.

And we then asked them for a dry hole contribution and they declined to go along on that line, so we in effect drilled the well tight.
