TAYLOR: The application of 5 Yates Petroleum Corporation for an unorthodox oil well loca-6 tion, Lea County, New Mexico. 7 MS. AUBREY: Karen Aubrey, Kel-8 lahin and Kellahin, representing the applicant. 9 I have one witness to be sworn. MR. QUINTANA: Are there other 10 appearances in this case? 11 If not, will the witness please 12 stand and be sworn? 13 14 (Witness sworn.) 15 16 TODD M. WILSON, 17 being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit: 18 19 DIRECT EXAMINATION 20 BY MS. AUBREY: 21 Would you state your name, please? Q 22 А Todd Wilson. 23 Mr. Wilson, where are you employed? Ο 24 Rio Pecos Corporation in Midland, Texas. A 25 Q And what is your relationship with Yates

Δ 1 Petroleum Corporation, the applicant in this case? 2 They are the original company that took А 3 the prospect from us and had the original well drilled. 4 Have you testified before the Oil Conser-0 5 vation Division and its examiners before, Mr. Wilson, and 6 had your qualifications made a matter of record? 7 А Yes, I have. 8 Ο Are you familiar with the application of Yates Petroleum for an unorthodox well location in the Casey 9 Strawn Pool at a location 660 from the north line and 1100 10 feet from the west line in Section 27, Township 16 South, 11 Range 37 East? 12 Α Yes, I am. 13 MS. AUBREY: Mr. Examiner, are 14 the witness' qualifications acceptable? 15 MR. QUINTANA: Yes, they are. 16 Wilson, have you prepared exhibits Q Mr. for the consideration of the Examiner this morning? 17 Yes, I have four exhibits. А 18 Let me refer you first to Exhibit Number 0 19 One. Can you look at that and explain for the Examiner what 20 the various colors mean on this map? 21 А Exhibit One is a copy of a land map, Lea 22 County, New Mexico. 23 The area outlined in orange encompasses 24 the 80-acre proration units within the already proven Casey Field. 25

5 1 The area outlined in green encloses the 2 acreage that we have under possession and the area outlined 3 in red will be the dedicated 80-acre unit to the No. 2 Well 4 to be drilled in here. 5 Mr. Wilson, is the proposed location Ο 6 shown on Exhibit Number One? 7 Yes. А 8 0 Okay. It's shown as a red dot in the north half А 9 of the northwest quarter of Section 26. 10 0 Okay, and does that -- does Exhibit Num-11 per One also show another well within the red outline there? 12 А Yes. There is a black dot right on the 13 east edge of the red unit outline. The name of that well is 14 Yates Petroleum Corporation Shipp "ZI" No. 1. 15 0 Is that a producing well, Mr. Wilson? 16 Α Yes. Currently the initial potential on it was for pumping 10 barrels of oil per day, 40 barrels of 17 water per day, and 10,000 cubic feet of gas per day. 18 And what formation is that well completed 0 19 in? 20 А In the Strawn formation. 21 Do you know whether or not there are any Q 22 present plans for plugging that well? 23 Yes, that well will be abandoned in А the 24 Strawn formation with -- a recompletion attempt will be made 25 in the Paddock as soon as the drilling of the No. 2 Well is

6 1 underway. 2 Wilson, do you know what a standard Mr. 0 3 location in the Casey Strawn is? 4 A standard location for the North Casey А 5 in this area should be within 150 feet of the center Field 6 of a quarter quarter section. 7 And can you tell the Examiner how close Ο 8 to the outer boundary your proposed unorthodox location is? А Our unorthodox would be 290 feet removed 9 from the furthest legal location underneath the field rules. 10 0 In connection with the unorthodox loca-11 have you received any objection by any offset operation, 12 tors to this proposed location? 13 А No, we have not. 14 0 Let me refer you now to Exhibit Number 15 Owo. Will you look at that and tell the Examiner what that 16 exhibit shows? Exhibit Two is a copy of a portion of the 17 А CNL-FDC log on the Yates Shipp "ZI" No. 1. 18 On it is marked top of Strawn series, top 19 of Lower Strawn limestone, and indicated perforations for 20 the pay zone in that well within the Lower Strawn limestone 21 formation. 22 0 Let me refer you now to Exhibit Number 23 Three. Can you identify that for the examiner? 24 А Exhibit Three is a copy of Okay. the 25 cipmeter from, continuous dipmeter that was run on the Shipp

7 1 'ZI" No. 1. The interval that we're primarily concerned 2 with on this dipmeter log is from 11,450 feet to 11,510 3 feet. This outlines what we feel is mound facies. The dip-4 meter displays continuous north 150 degrees east dip with an 5 inclination of approximately up to 30 degrees. 6 This log is our key evidence for wanting 7 to drill the unorthodox location based upon the dip rate in 8 this wellbore. So your choice of the unorthodox location 0 9 is based upon structure. 10 А Yes. 11 Let me refer you now to Exhibit Number Q 12 Four. Can you identify that for the examiner? 13 Okay, Exhibit Four is a structure А map 14 contoured on top of the Lower Strawn limestone, which in 15 this area is the main pay zone in the Casey Field area. 16 Basically all it is showing is what the dipmeter log is indicating to us and the direction to go to 17 have the next location on the crest of the mound. 18 Exhibit Number Four shows that you're 0 19 moving up dip? 20 Yes, it shows moving up dip. А 21 Q In your opinion, Mr. Wilson, can a well 22 this unorthodox location efficiently and economically at 23 drain the designated acreage? 24 Α It should be able to, yes. 25 And you'll be dedicating 80 acres to this 0

8 1 well, is that correct? 2 Yes. That's the field rule. А 3 Q Mr. Wilson, will granting of Yates' ap-4 plication protect correlative rights, promote conservation, 5 and prevent waste? 6 Yes, it will. Α 7 Q Were Exhibits One through Four prepared 8 by you, Mr. Wilson? 9 Α Yes, they were. MS. AUBREY: Mr. Examiner, I 10 cender Exhibits One through Four. 11 MR. QUINTANA: Exhibits One 12 through Four will be admitted. 13 MS. AUBREY: And I have no more 14 questions of this witness. 15 MR. QUINTANA: I have no fur-16 ther questions of the witness.
