Comes now, GGC Incorporated, by and through its undersigned attorneys, and hereby makes application for a treating plant permit, and in support of this application would show the Division:

- That its principal place of business is located in Lea County, New Mexico.
- 2. That this application is made pursuant to the provisions of Rule 312 of the Rules and Regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division.
- 3. That the proposed location of the treating plant is in Section 29, Township 9 South, Range 33 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.
 - 4. That the type and capacity of the plant is as follows:
- a. One 400 barrel storage tank for incoming tank bottoms and sediment oil;
 - b. One 210 barrel storage tank for condensate;
 - c. One 40 Horsepower steam boiler;
 - d. Two 300 barrel clean oil tanks;
 - e. Incoming product to be treated with chemicals and

mixed with condensate. If necessary, tank heated and treated with distillate then product into storage for transmission to purchaser;

- f. Water is disposed of by Kenneth Tank Service, Crossroads, New Mexico. 2 m. Wut of Curum Camby (solub) also
- g. The capacity of the plant is approximately 2000 barrels per month but will be dependent upon the amount of incoming product.
